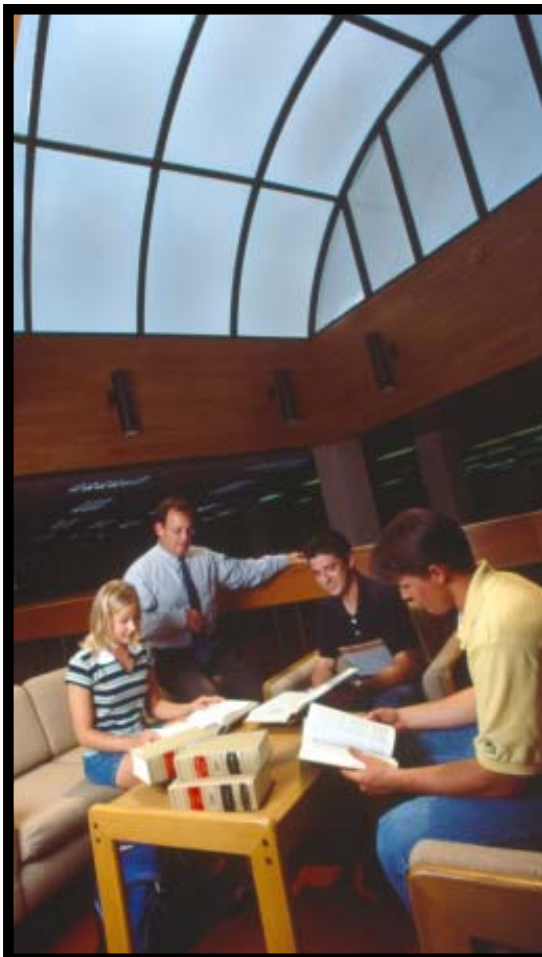

General Information

This bulletin provides information on the participating institutions and degree programs included in the Midwest Student Exchange Program for the 2004-05 academic year.

The Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP) was established by the Midwestern Higher Education Compact to increase interstate educational opportunities for students in its member states. The program enables resident of **Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska and North Dakota** to enroll in the institutions and programs designated in this bulletin at reduced tuition levels.

Tuitions for MSEP students attending designated out-of-state independent institutions receive at least a 10 percent reduction in their tuition. In all

programs, the cost to MSEP student is lower than regular nonresident tuition.

State and institutional participation in the Midwest Student Exchange Program is voluntary. Only those programs and institutions that appear in this bulletin will receive MSEP students in the 2004-05 academic year.* A student's eligibility for admission is determined by each participating institution.

Under MSEP policies, students from participating states are awarded MSEP tuition reductions only at those degree levels (associate, baccalaureate, master's or doctorate) for which their home state offers programs to MSEP students from other states. Institutions may expand degree level offerings if they so choose.

This is how it works...

Tuition

An MSEP student pays no more than 150 percent of the institution's regular resident tuition plus any required fees. For example, at a college with a resident tuition of \$500 per semester and a nonresident tuition of \$1200 per semester, tuition for an MSEP student will be no more than \$900 per semester. The full cost (tuition plus fees) of any specific program can usually be determined from the catalog of the institution or by contacting the institution's office of admissions.

Application, Admission and Renewal

The student applies for admission directly to the institution (as listed in this bulletin) of his or her choice. On the institution's application form, the student indicates that MSEP status is desired upon admission. The participating MSEP institution will evaluate the student's application for admission and request for MSEP status and will then respond directly to the student.

The listing on the following pages identify the appropriate contact office for each MSEP institution and their enrollment requirements. In all cases, the admitting institution reserves the right to admit or deny admission to any applicant.

Students must indicate on their applicant for admission that they seek admission as an MSEP student.

Students **may need to reapply** to maintain MSEP students. Check with the campus MSEP contact.

When changing to another program (at the same or different institution), a student may keep MSEP status only if the new program is also listed in the bulletin and/or the change is approved by the admitting institution. Extension of the MSEP tuition privilege to students already enrolled is at the discretion of the institution.

Program Eligibility

In MSEP, students are awarded tuition reductions only at those degree levels for which their home state offers programs to MSEP students from other states. This means that if you come from Kansas, you may attend an MSEP institution in Missouri that offers baccalaureate, master's and doctoral degrees. In Minnesota, however, no MSEP institution currently offers a doctoral degree, so while you are eligible, you would not be able to use MSEP for a doctorate in Minnesota.

To simplify the process of finding out which state offer degrees from which you are eligible, we have

created the chart below. Find your state of residency at the top, then the destination state and degree level at the left. At the intersection of the two, you will find a "yes" if you are eligible for that level of degree in that state or a dash, if you are not.

Please remember that not all institutions in a given state offer all levels of degrees. Institutions may expand degree level offerings if they so choose. Consult the following pages and listed contacts for further information.

In Kansas, undergraduate students participating in the Midwest Student Exchange Program:

1. Must have an ACT score of 24 or higher, or a SAT score of 1100 or higher;
2. Must rank in the top 25% of their high school graduating class;
3. Must complete the thirteen-unit college preparatory curriculum as defined by ACT, including four units of English and three units each of social science, natural science & mathematics; and
4. Must enroll as full-time students, maintain a 3.0 GPA and make acceptable progress toward the degree as verified by the department chair.

All undergraduate students participating in the Midwest Student Exchange Program in Kansas must meet the admission requirements. However, specific academic programs may have higher or additional requirements that students must meet in order to be admitted. Graduate students will be admitted to MSEP academic programs according to the admissions requirement of the graduate school at the participating university.

Northwest Missouri State University

All undergraduate and graduate programs are open on a space-available basis; initial placements under MSEP will be limited. First-time freshmen that have a combined percentile index of 150 (refer to admissions application to calculate Admissions Index) will be considered. Subsequently, a limited number of seats will be made available to transferring, continuing, returning and graduate students.

Transferring, continuing and returning students with fewer than 28 hours of completed college coursework will be automatically eligible for MSEP if they meet the new freshman requirements listed above. (Students' high school transcript and ACT score report must be submitted.) Students with 28 or more hours completed must have a cumulative college GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Graduate students must be enrolled full-time (not receiving a graduate assistantship from Northwest), and must have completed a bachelor's degree with a cumulative college GPA of at least 3.25 to be considered.

To meet renewal requirements, undergraduate students must maintain a 3.0 Northwest cumulative GPA and complete 24 credit hours per academic year. The award will be given for a maximum of 132 credits for entering freshmen. Transferring, continuing and returning students will be prorated as they enter the program. Graduate students must maintain a 3.4 Northwest cumulative GPA and complete 18 hours per academic year; the award will be given for a maximum of 40 credits.

Due to increases in tuition and fees, students and their families are paying a larger portion of postsecondary education costs.

Since 1994, MHEC has been providing more affordable educational opportunities for students to attend out-of-state institutions at reduced costs. The Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP) serves as the Midwest's largest multi-state tuition reciprocity program. We are glad you are interested

in more information about MSEP. Often mistaken as a scholarship, MSEP is actually a means to receive reduced tuition rates. Open to residents in the states of Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska and North Dakota, over 125 campuses in these states have enrolled students at reduced rates.

To receive the reduction, you must apply for admission directly to the institution in which you are interested. On the application form you will indicate that MSEP status is desired upon admission. The participating MSEP institution will then evaluate your application for admission and request for MSEP status and will respond directly to you. This bulletin provides you with the institution contact information as well as eligibility requirements.
