HOME SWEET HOME

After setting four school records in a 116-114 double overtime loss at #17 Central Oklahoma, Emporia State makes their home debut against Bethany.

LAST TIME OUT

Tim Niles scored a career high 45 points on an MIAA record eight of eight from behind the three point line, but Emporia State came up short 116-114 in double overtime at #17 Central Oklahoma. The Hornets shot a school record .783 (18 of 23) from three-point range. There were 16 ties and 24 lead changes in the game. Niles' 45 points were the most by a Hornet since Thomas Vincent scored 52 points against Southwest Baptist on Feb. 28, 2004. Jordan Stout finished with a career high 12 points and Matt Boswell added a career high 16 points.

THE COACHES

David Moe is 132-98 in his ninth season at ESU and is 125-79 since 2002-03. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in six of the last seven years. He is the third winningest coach in ESU history behind Gus Fish and Ron Slaymaker. He is 2-0 against Bethany.

Clair Oleen has 215 wins in his 17th season at Bethany. He is 0-3 against ESU.

SCOUTING THE SWEDES

Bethany is 1-3 on the season with three of the four games on the road. They defeated Haskell Indian Nations 97-84 for thier lone win. Senior guard Rodd Williams averages 17.8 points per game with 12 made three pointers. Jason Schneider contributes 10.3 points per game off the bench.

SERIES HISTORY

ESU leads the all-time series 32-1 and has not lost to Bethany since the 1915-16 season.

LAST TIME OUT VS. BETHANY

In the final non-conference action of the 2008-09 season, Emporia State defeated Bethany 89-61 in White Auditorium. Lamar Wilbern led all scorers with 20 points to lead five Hornets in double figures. Bethany led by as many as eight points in the first half, but ESU ended the half on a 16-2 run to take a 39-33 lead into the lockerroom. The run would grow to 29-2 as the Hornets scored the first 13 points of the second half.

UP NEXT

The Hornets will welcome #17 Central Oklahoma into White Auditorium for a rematch of their season opening 116-114 double overtime thriller. Tip-off for the Big Monday match up is set for 7 p.m. on November 23.

RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS

The Hornets are 37-11 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last seven seasons. They averaged 101.0 points in their two exhibition games and scored 114 in thier season opener at Central Oklahoma. ESU averaged 83.9 points per game in White Auditorium last season.

A DAY AT HOME

The Hornetshave won 11 straight home openers and have never lost a home opener under David Moe. ESU has had seven straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season. The Hornets are 82-21 for a .796 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets finished the season 12-2 at home with two wins over ranked opponents.

FRIENDLY CONFINES

ESU has won 83 of their last 105 games in White Auditorium. Fifteen of the 22 losses have been by less than ten points. The Hornets are 88-30 (.746) under David Moe at home and 308-131 (.702) since 1979 in White Auditorium. The Hornets were 12-2 in White Auditorium last season including a win over then #12 Missouri Southern for their second home win over a ranked opponent.

BEHIND THE LINE

ESU went 18 of 23 (.783) from behind the arc against Central Oklahoma to set a school record for three point percentage and tie the school record for made threes. The Hornets led the MIAA and were second in the nation in three-point shooting percentage last year. ESU was second in the MIAA and 14th in the nation in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.9 on the year. Robert Moores led the nation in three-point accuracy, connecting on 51.9% of his shots behind the arc. Emporia State was second in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .325 on the season.

NILES AND NILES OF REAL ESTATE

Guard **Tim Niles** (Jr./Brooklyn, N.Y.) scored a career high 45 points at Central Oklahoma. It is the most points scored by a Hornet in a season opener in the 107 years of basketball. He set the MIAA record for most made three pointers without a miss by hitting eight of eight from behind the arc. His 45 points are the most scored by a Hornet since Thomas Vincent went for 52 against Southwest Baptist on Feb. 28, 2004. He averaged 22.0 points per game in ESU's two exhibition wins. He was named to the MIAA All-Defensive team last season. He scored a game high 22 points against Missouri Southern, with five three pointers. He scored a team high 18 at Southwest Baptist. He had a career high 23 against Truman. He had 16 points and eight rebounds against Neb.-Omaha. He had a career high six assists in the Hornets win over Benedictine last season. He was second in the MIAA in 3-point percentage last season.

LAMAR, NEBRASKA

Guard **Lamar Wilbern** (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) had 16 points and seven rebounds at Central Oklahoma. He averaged a double-double in ESU's two exhibition games. He had 21 points and 11 boards against Livin the Dream after scoring 16 points with 11 rebounds against the ESU Alumni. He was a second-team All-MIAA selection last season. He scored 26 points with six rebounds against Ft. Hays State. He scored 19 points at Washburn. He had 19 points, nine rebounds and seven assists against Pittsburg State. He had 20 points and 14 rebounds at Neb.-Omaha. He had a game high 16 points against #12 Central Missouri. He scored 20 points at Missouri Western. He scored 18 points against Washburn. He had a career high 27 points and 16 rebounds against Pittsburg State. He had a game high 21 points against #3 Southwest Baptist. He had a double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against Neb.-Omaha. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against Truman. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He recorded a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at Central Missouri. He had 19 points and five assists against Missouri Western. He ranked seventh in the MIAA in scoring, fourth in rebounding, seventh in field goal percentage, and ninth in free throw percentage last season.

BOXING DAY

Forward **Jeremiah Box** (Jr./Rockford, Ill.) had 16 points, five rebounds, three steals, two blocks and two assists against Livin the Dream. He scored 17 points on eight of 11 shooting against the ESU Alumni. Last season he had 13 points on five of seven shooting against Washburn in the MIAA Tourney after scoring a game high 21 points and eight rebounds at Washburn. He had 12 points against Northwest Missouri. He had 12 points against Ft. Hays State. He had 14 points against #12 Missouri Southern. He had 14 points and eight rebounds against Neb.-Omaha. He had 15 points with a career high three blocks against Missouri Western. He scored 22 points against Ottawa. He had a career high 28 points at Eastern New Mexico.

FULL HOUSE

Forward **Adam Holthaus** (So./Topeka, Kan.) had nine points and seven rebounds at Central Oklahoma. Last season he tied his career high with 19 points against Pittsburg State. He had 12 points and a team high six rebounds against Missouri Southern. He had 13 points against Nebraska-Omaha. He had 10 points against #12 Central Missouri. He had 11 points against Truman. He scored in double figures for the third straight game with 13 points against Ft. Hays State. He scored 10 points in the Hornets first win over Washburn. He had a career high 19 points on seven of seven shooting from the field at Pittsburg State. He had four points and five boards against #3 Southwest Baptist. He had 14 points against Neb.-Omaha. He had 10 points against Bethany. He had 10 points and a career high nine rebounds against KSU. He reached double figures in 13 games and shot .586 from the field in MIAA games.

THREE SPORTIN' IT

Guard **Dustin Andrews** (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) became the first person in history to score a point in an MIAA football game, MIAA Tournament basketball game, and the MIAA indoor and outdoor track and field championships. He scored nine points on three treys with five assists against Ft. Hays State last season. He led ESU with five assists against Missouri Southern. He had ten points against Neb.-Omaha. He had a career high 19 points against Washburn with five three pointers. He had a career high 13 points against #3 Southwest Baptist. He scored 11 points against Truman. He had seven points to go along with a career high seven assists in ESU's win over Benedictine. He had a career high eight rebounds against Newman. He is believed to be the first "true" three sport athlete at Emporia State since ESU Hall of Honor member Keith Caywood competed in football, basketball and track for the Hornets from 1938-41. Andrews was seven of 11 on PAT's and two of two on field goals for the Hornet football team and is an All-American high jumper for the ESU track and field team.

A STOUT WIND

Guard **Jordan Stout** (So./Madison, Kan.) scored a career high 12 points on four of four shooting from behind the three-point line at Central Oklahoma. He has not missed a three-pointer since Jan. 28, 2009 against Missouri Western and has tied Thomas Vincent's ESU and MIAA record of 11 consecutive made threes. He was two for two with both makes coming from behind the three-point line against Washburn in the MIAA Tournament. He shot .727 from the field in the month of February. He had a career high eight points against Nebraska-Omaha.

TAKING IT TO THE MATT

Guard **Matt Boswell** (So./Wichita, Kan.) had career highs of 16 points, five rebounds and four assists at Central Oklahoma. He was five for five from the field with a pair of three pointers. He started eight games for the Hornets last season.

TAYLOR MADE

Guard **Taylor Euler** (Fr./Emporia, Kan.) scored five points with three assists at Central Oklahoma and hit a three-pointer with 11 seconds left to send the game to a second overtime. He had nine points, five rebounds and four assists against Livin the Dream. He scored 12 points with a team high seven assists in his ESU exhibition debut against the Hornet Alumni.

Center **Doug Moore** (Jr./Wichita, Kan.) scored seven points with five rebounds against Livin the Dream. He scored seven points and had six rebounds against Bethany. He had a career high nine points along with tying a career high nine rebounds against Central Christian. He had a career high nine rebounds against Benedictine.

MR. NELSON

Forward **Matt Nelson** (Jr./Topeka, Kan.) scored two points against the ESU Alumni. He averaged 7.0 points and 3.8 rebounds for Allen County CC last season.

CATCHING ON

Forward **Danny McEvoy** (Sr./Leavenworth, Kan.) scored four points with two rebounds and an assist in five minutes against Livin the Dream. He was the Hornets leading receiver for the Hornet football team over the last two seasons and was an honorable mention All-MIAA receiver this year. He played in five basketball games as a freshman at Hutchinson CC.

OUT ON THE MOORES

Guard **Robert Moores** (Jr./Elmhurst, Ill.) is out with a stress fracture in his lower leg. He was an honorable mention All-MIAA performer. He led the nation in three-point field goal shooting last season. He scored a career high 31 points against Washburn in the MIAA Tournament. He had 16 points and five assists against Ft. Hays State. He had a game high 21 points at Washburn. He had 20 points at Missouri Southern. He had 19 points against Neb.-Omaha. He had 19 points against Northwest Missouri and Truman. He had his first double-double against Central Christian with 17 points and 10 assists. He had 20 points and four assists against Missouri Western. He had 23 points against then #21 Northwest Missouri. He scored a game high 20 points against Benedictine. He was ranked tenth in the MIAA in scoring, led the league in 3-point percentage, was ranked fourth in assist/turnover ratio, field goal percentage and made three pointers. His .519 percentage from behind the arc was an ESU single season record.

REGIONALLY SPEAKING

As a league, the MIAA is 10-3 against non-conference foes this year after going 70-16 against non-conference opponents last season. The conference was 37-12 against Division II teams and went 18-7 against teams in the South Central Region. ESU was the only team to win on the road against both a Lone Star and Heartland opponent last season.
