REGIONALLY SPEAKING

Emporia State will face Angelo State in the first round of the NCAA Division II South Central Regional. ESU is 6-3 over their last nine post-season games played at Crane Stadium. Emporia State was the last host to advance to the world series in 2006. This is the sixth straight year and seventh time overall that ESU has advanced regionals. ESU is 8-3 in the last three regionals.

LAST AT-BAT

The Hornets were eliminated from the MIAA tournament with a 8-4 loss to #11 Central Missouri. Conner Crumbliss had two RBI while Kenny Burkhead went two for five with one run driven in. Caleb Williamson added the other RBI for the Hornets. Ben Graham pitched 5.1 innings in relief allowing only two runs while Ryan Anthony earned his third loss of the season.

THE COACHES

Bob Fornelli is 258-101 in his sixth season at ESU and is 564-214 overall in his 13th year as a head coach. He has led ESU to two straight MIAA Championships and two out of the last three. A 1991 graduate of ESU, Fornelli has taken teams to the NCAA tournament ten times, including his first five years at ESU, and was the national runner-up in 2000 while at FHSU.

Kevin Brooks is 194-98 in his fifth season with the Rams.

SCOUTING REPORT

The Rams are 43-18 and finished as the Lone Star regular season and tournament runners-up. At the plate they are led by Chris Adamson who is hitting .421 and Keith Towne who has 26 home runs and 85 RBI. On the mound Kenny Elkind is 10-2 with a 3.72 ERA.

THE SERIES

Angelo State leads the series 3-0 with all three meetings coming in 2007 in San Angelo.

LAST TIME THEY PLAYED

The #8 ESU baseball team committed four errors and gave up six unearned runs in a 13-10 loss at #33 Angelo State. ESU was able to get production out of the bottom of the order as eight and nine hitters Tim Barger and Bill Sharp were a combined five for ten with six RBI and three runs scored.

REGIONALLY SPEAKING PART TWO

The Hornets are the fourth seed in the NCAA Division II South Central Regional. ESU ranks 17th in the nation in the American Baseball Coaches Association top 30 poll.

ON DECK

With a win ESU would play the winner of Abilene Christian or Neb.-Omaha at 7 p.m. on May 15th. With a loss ESU would play the winner of Central Missouri or UT-Permian Basin at 3:30 p.m.

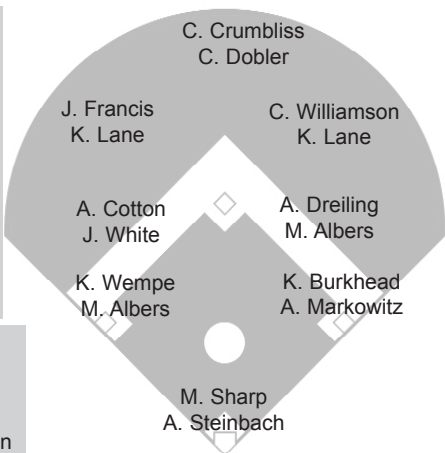

HE'S A WINNER

Emporia State head baseball coach Bob Fornelli has 564 career wins and 259 wins at Emporia State. Coach Fornelli picked up his 250th win as a Hornet with 16-0 win over Truman on April 11, 2009. Fornelli is the third winningest coach at Emporia State by victories (259) and is ranked first by percentage (.719), where he ranks third nationally, ahead of ESU Hall of Honor member Dave Bingham. Overall, Fornelli is 258-101 (.719) in his sixth year at ESU and 564-214 (.725) in his 13th season as a head coach. Fornelli got his 500th career win with an 8-5 victory over Pittsburg State on April 1, 2008.

GET THOSE BATS OUT Y'ALL

The Hornets are hitting the ball well, averaging .333 on the year as a team good for second in the MIAA. They have outscored their opponents 469-263 through the first 54 games and are outscoring teams 219-112 in the fifth through eighth innings. The Hornets have 202 extra base hits including 48 home runs on the season. They are second in the MIAA in batting average. They are currently leading the league in total doubles, leading in runs scored, runs driven in, total hits and third in total home runs and second in stolen bases. They are third in the nation in doubles, 13th in the nation in runs and 14th in the nation in scoring.

IN THE FIELD AND ON THE HILL

Defensively ESU has only committed 64 errors on the season through 54 games good for .967 fielding percentage which leads the MIAA and ranks ninth in the nation. The Hornets have also turned 45 double plays so far this year which is second in the MIAA. ESU starting pitchers are a combined 31-9 with seven complete games and four shut-outs. As a staff ESU ranks fifth in the MIAA in pitching. Combined as a staff, ESU starters are only allowing opposing hitters a .266 batting average. The Hornet bullpen has 11 wins this season along with ten saves.

COOL, CONNER AND COLLECTED

Outfielder **Conner Crumbliss** (Sr./Arkansas City, Kan.) was named the MIAA Player of the Year. He is hitting .407 this year and has 35 extra base hits with 26 doubles, four home runs and five triples. He is third on the team in RBI with 49 on the year and has a .490 on-base percentage and a .636 slugging percentage. He has a team high 29 stolen bases on the season including six times during the year stealing second and third consecutively. He is currently second in the MIAA in hits, and is second in total bases, doubles and third in stolen bases, fourth in batting average and on-base percentage, eighth in slugging percentage and ninth in runs batted in. His steal of home plate against UNO tied the game. He is hitting .434 on the season against left-handed pitchers. Three of his four home runs this season have been to lead off the game. He also has six assists this season from his center field position. He is second in the nation in runs scored per game and third in total doubles. He holds the ESU career record in runs scored and doubles. He needs only five hits over the remaining games to set a new career hits record at ESU. He holds the MIAA career record in total doubles with 74 and also holds the MIAA career record for hits with 298.

KENNY THE SHARK

First baseman **Kenny Burkhead** (Jr./Berryton, Kan.) was named first-team All-MIAA. He has been named MIAA Hitter of the Week twice this season. He is hitting .380 to go along with nine home runs, 24 doubles, one triple and a team high 75 RBI. He is leading the MIAA in runs batted in. He is currently fourth in the league in hits per game and third in total bases. He is ranked third in doubles and seventh in runs scored per game. He is currently seventh in the MIAA and second on the team in stolen bases with 23 on the year. Against Central Oklahoma he was five of six with three doubles and seven RBI and scored three runs as ESU won the game 18-13. He is hitting .417 with runners are on base this season and ups that average to .434 this year with runners in scoring position. He is sixth in the nation in RBI per game.

SHARP DRESSED MAN!

Catcher **Mike Sharp** (Sr./Liberty, Mo.) was named first team All-MIAA. He is currently leading the MIAA in home runs and fourth in runs driven in per game. He is hitting .374 on the year in 49 starts behind the plate. He is leading the team with 13 home runs and is second in RBI with 53 on the year. He has a .682 slugging percentage with 29 of his 67 hits going for extra bases. He is second in the MIAA in slugging percentage, seventh in total bases and ninth in doubles per game.

ST. FRANCIS

Outfielder **Jeremy Francis** (Jr./Emporia, Kan.) is hitting .351 with three home runs and 40 RBI. He has 17 stolen bases for ESU this year and his steal of home against UNO gave ESU the lead for good. He is hitting .394 when runners are on base this season. He is currently sixth in the MIAA in runs scored and ninth in stolen bases.

THAT'S RIGHT COTTON

Shortstop **Andy Cotton** (Jr./Lincoln, Neb.) was named honorable mention All-MIAA. He has started 48 games for the Hornets this season and is hitting .342 with one home run and 27 RBI. He also has four stolen bases on the season. He is hitting .357 over his last ten games.

NOT SO WEMPE

Third baseman **Kevin Wempe** (So./Topeka, Kan.) is hitting .302 this season and has 22 extra base hits. He has six home runs to go along with 34 RBI. He has an on-base percentage of .380 on the year as he leads the team in hit-by-pitch with 13 on the year. He is hitting .355 this season when there are two outs in the inning. He is currently ranked ninth in the MIAA in runs scored.

TONY'S PIZZA

Second baseman **Anthony Dreiling** (Sr./Lawrence, Kan.) is hitting .271 on the year with four home runs and 36 runs driven in. He has seven stolen bases on the season and is hitting .300 against right handed pitching. He is hitting .750 with a runner on third and less than two outs on the year.

WILLIAMSON TELL OVERTURE

Outfielder **Caleb Williamson** (Sr./Baxter Springs, Kan.) is hitting .294 this season in 39 appearances including 28 starts for the Hornets. He is hitting .323 over the Hornets last ten games. He has a .333 batting average this season when runners are in scoring position.

MULBERRY LANE

Outfielder **Kellen Lane** (Sr./Borger, Texas) is hitting .276 on the year with 21 RBI and three stolen bases. He has now made 28 starts this season with most of them coming in right field or at designated hitter against right-handed pitching.

THE GREAT WHITE HOPE

Second baseman **Jacob White** (Jr./Kansas City, Kan.) has started ten games in the infield for ESU this season. He is hitting .405 on the season with one triple and three stolen bases. He has scored 14 runs this years and has an on-base percentage of .500 with seven walks.

ON THE MARC

Designated hitter **Marc Albers** (Jr./Lawrence, Kan.) had his first career home run against Washburn to tie the game. He is hitting .281 on the season starting 12 games at DH primarily against left handed pitchers. He is hitting .323 against left-handed pitchers this season. He has a .421 slugging percentage on the season.

RYAN EXPRESS

Lefthander **Ryan Anthony** (Sr./Overland Park, Kan.) was named second team All-MIAA. He picked up his first complete game and first shutout of the season in the Hornets 10-0 win over Fort Hays State. He earned his second complete game win with a 2-1 victory against Central Missouri. He added another complete game shut-out against SBU on May 2nd. He is 8-3 on the year with a 3.23 ERA. Opposing hitters are only hitting .222 against him through 14 appearances. Anthony is only allowing left handed hitters to hit .219 against him this season. He is currently fifth in the MIAA in wins and second in opponent batting average. He is seventh in the MIAA in ERA and second in shut-outs and fifth in strikeouts.

BIG BEN

Righthander **Ben Graham** (Jr./Holden, Mo.) earned his third complete game win against Fort Hays State. He pitched his second complete game of the season in the win against Northwest Missouri. He threw the Hornets first complete game of the season in a 6-1 win over Colorado Mines. He is now 6-3 on the year with a 3.34 ERA. He has 57 strikeouts this season while only giving up nine walks. He has been tough against right handed hitting this season only allowing righties a .270 average on the season. He is striking out 6.3 batters for every walk he has allowed this season. Teams have only stolen five bases out of nine attempts with him on the mound. He is eighth in the MIAA in earned run average.

JOHNNY APPLEHANS

Lefthander **Tyler Applehans** (Sr./Fredonia, Kan.) was named second team All-MIAA this season. He was the first Hornets pitcher to earn MIAA Athlete of the Week honors. He had a career high 17 strikeouts against TSU. He is 7-3 for the Hornets this season with a 3.70 ERA and is allowing hitters only a .233 average against him this season. He is eighth in the MIAA in wins this season. He is leading the MIAA in strikeouts and is fifth in the league in opponent batting average. He was a unanimous first team All-MIAA pitcher during the 2008 season.

COLBY JACK

Righthander **Colby Killian** (Jr./McMinnville, Tenn.) is 5-0 and has 67 strikeouts in 61.0 innings pitched this season. He is currently second on the team and fourth in the MIAA in strikeouts per game.

I'D LIKE SOME MOORE PLEASE

Righthander **Cole Moore** (Jr./Lee's Summit, Mo.) is 5-0 this season after picking up his fifth straight win with a 18-8 victory over Truman. He has a ERA of 4.97 on the season in 38.0 innings pitched.

KING OF TOWN

Righthander **Dominic King** (Fr./Wichita, Kan.) is now 3-0 on the season with a 4.60 ERA. He has pitched 31.1 innings in 18 appearances as a true freshman.

GO, DIEGO, GO

Righthander **Diego Soto** (Sr./Tucson, Ariz.) was named honorable mention All-MIAA. He leads the Hornets in appearances with 26 and has a 5-2 record with nine saves. He ranks 15th nationally in saves. He is only allowing hitters a .221 batting average against him with a 2.75 ERA in 36.0 innings pitched. He is currently second in the MIAA in saves and second in appearances. He has 41 strikeouts on the year.
