HERE WE ARE AGAIN

Emporia State will face Central Missouri for the second time in as many days for the NCAA Division II South Central Regional Championship. Should the Hornets win, they will make their second trip to the world series in four years. They would face Grand Valley State in an opening round game on May 23 in Cary, North Carolina.

LAST AT-BAT

The #17 Emporia State baseball team used a two run seventh inning to come from behind for a 5-3 victory over #16 Angelo State. Dominik King earned his fourth win out of the pin for ESU. The ESU bats came to life as they outscored their opponents 42-13 to make their way into tomorrow's winner take all championship game.

THE COACHES

Bob Fornelli is 261-102 in his sixth season at ESU and is 567-215 overall in his 13th year overall. He has led ESU to two straight MIAA Championships and three of the last four. A 1991 graduate of ESU, Fornelli has taken teams to the NCAA Tournament 11 times, and was the national runner-up in 2000 while at FHSU.

Tom Myers is 91-31 in his second season with the Mules.

SCOUTING REPORT

Central Missouri is 44-14 and finished as the MIAA regular season and tournament runners-up. Chance Tuttle is batting .393 with 12 home runs and 53 RBI to lead the UCM offense. The Mules will likely look to Thursday's starter Brooks Martin to take the ball.

IN POST-SEASON PLAY

ESU is 11-5 in regional play since 2006. ESU is 9-4 over their last 13 post-season games played at Crane Stadium.

THE SERIES

UCM leads the overall series 98-48 but ESU has taken three of six this season. This will be the sixth time the two have met in regional play, with the Mules winning the previous five meetings.

LAST TIME THEY PLAYED

The #17 Emporia State baseball team fell 2-1 to #13 Central Missouri. ESU led much of the game before the Mules scored two in the top half of the ninth inning. The game only saw 11 total hits as the Hornets outhit the Mules 7-4. Tyler Applehans pitched his longest career outing going 8.1 innings and allowing only four hits and two earned runs. Diego Soto closed out the final two innings of play. At the plate Conner Crumbliss had two doubles.

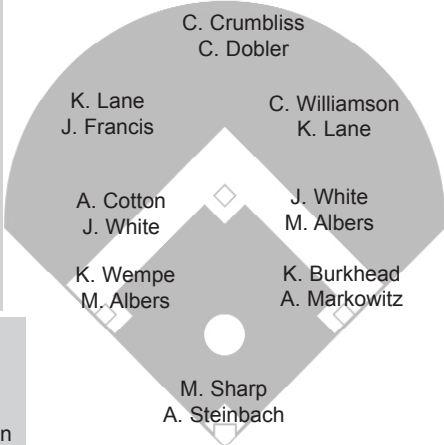

HE'S A WINNER

Emporia State head baseball coach Bob Fomelli has 567 career wins and 261 wins at Emporia State. Coach Fomelli picked up his 250th win as a Hornet with 16-0 win over Truman on April 11, 2009. Fomelli is the third winningest coach at Emporia State by victories (261) and is ranked first by percentage (.720), where he ranks third nationally, ahead of ESU Hall of Honor member Dave Bingham. Overall, Fomelli is 261-102 (.720) in his sixth year at ESU and 567-215 (.726) in his 13th season as a head coach. Fomelli got his 500th career win with an 8-5 victory over Pittsburg State on April 1, 2008.

GET THOSE BATS OUT Y'ALL

The Hornets are batting .375 in the regional with 24 extra base hits in the first four games. ESU is hitting .336 as a team good for second in the MIAA. They have outscored their opponents 511-276 on the season and are outscoring teams 248-133 from the fifth inning on. The Hornets have 226 extra base hits including 55 home runs on the season. They are second in the MIAA in batting average. They are currently leading the league in total doubles, leading in runs scored, runs driven in, total hits and third in total home runs and second in stolen bases. They are third in the nation in doubles, 13th in the nation in runs and 14th in the nation in scoring.

IN THE FIELD AND ON THE HILL

Defensively ESU has only committed 64 errors on the season through 58 games good for .969 fielding percentage which leads the MIAA and ranks ninth in the nation. The Hornets have also turned 49 double plays so far this year which is second in the MIAA. ESU starting pitchers are a combined 33-9 with seven complete games and four shut-outs. As a staff ESU ranks fifth in the MIAA in pitching. Combined as a staff, ESU starters are only allowing opposing hitters a .256 batting average. The Hornet bullpen has 12 wins this season along with 11 saves.

COOL, CONNER AND COLLECTED

Outfielder **Conner Crumbliss** (Sr./Arkansas City, Kan.) was named Second-Team Daktronics All-Region. He was named the MIAA Player of the Year. He is hitting .412 with a team high nine runs scored in the regional. He is hitting .415 this year and has 38 extra base hits with 28 doubles, five home runs and five triples. He is second on the team in RBI with 54 on the year and has a .492 on-base percentage and a .642 slugging percentage. He has a team high 29 stolen bases on the season including six times during the year stealing second and third consecutively. He is currently second in the MIAA in hits, and is second in total bases, doubles and third in stolen bases, fourth in batting average and on-base percentage, eighth in slugging percentage and ninth in runs batted in. His steal of home plate against UNO in the regular season tied the game. He is hitting .444 on the season against left-handed pitchers. Three of his five home runs this season have been to lead off the game. He also has seven assists this season from his center field position. He is second in the nation in runs scored per game and third in total doubles. He holds the ESU career record in hits, runs scored and doubles. He holds the MIAA career record in total doubles with 76 and needs just eight hits for a new MIAA record.

KENNY THE SHARK

First baseman **Kenny Burkhead** (Jr./Berryton, Kan.) was named First-Team Daktronics All-Region and First-Team All-MIAA. He has been named MIAA Hitter of the Week twice this season. He is sixth in the nation in RBI per game. He is hitting .579 in the regional with 11 hits in 19 at bats. In eight games at Crane Stadium this season he is batting .509 with 13 RBI. On the season he is hitting .396 to go along with ten home runs, 27 doubles, one triple and a team high 84 RBI. He is leading the MIAA in runs batted in. He is currently fourth in the league in hits per game and third in total bases. He is ranked third in doubles and seventh in runs scored per game. He is currently seventh in the MIAA and second on the team in stolen bases with 23 on the year. Burkhead had five hits and seven RBI against Angelo State, the second time this season he has done that. He is hitting .443 with runners on base this season and ups that average to .468 this year with runners in scoring position.

NOT SO WEMPE

Third baseman **Kevin Wempe** (So./Topeka, Kan.) moved up to the second spot in the line-up for the regional and is hitting .471 with a .882 slugging percentage in the four games. He reached base seven times going five for five with seven RBI against Angelo State in the first round. He is hitting .316 this season with 27 extra base hits. He has seven home runs along with 41 RBI. He has an on-base percentage of .394 on the year as he leads the team with 13 hit by pitch. He is hitting .397 this season when there are two outs in the inning. He is ranked ninth in the MIAA in runs scored.

THE GREAT WHITE HOPE

Second baseman **Jacob White** (Jr./Kansas City, Kan.) has started 13 games in the infield for ESU this season. He is batting .438 in the regional and .411 in five starts at Crane Stadium. He is hitting .415 on the season with three doubles, a triple and three stolen bases. He has scored 19 runs this year and has an on-base percentage of .492 with eight walks.

SHARP DRESSED MAN!

Catcher **Mike Sharp** (Sr./Liberty, Mo.) was named first team All-MIAA. He is currently leading the MIAA in home runs and fourth in runs driven in per game. He is hitting .373 on the year in 54 starts behind the plate. He is leading the team with 13 home runs and is third in RBI with 53 on the year. He has a .668 slugging percentage with 31 of his 72 hits going for extra bases. He is second in the MIAA in slugging percentage, seventh in total bases and ninth in doubles per game.

THAT'S RIGHT COTTON

Shortstop **Andy Cotton** (Jr./Lincoln, Neb.) was named honorable mention All-MIAA. He has started 52 games for the Hornets this season and is hitting .333 with three home runs and 33 RBI. He also has four stolen bases on the season. He has two home runs and eight RBI over his last ten games.

TONY'S PIZZA

Second baseman/designated hitter **Anthony Dreiling** (Sr./Lawrence, Kan.) is hitting .275 on the year with four home runs and 38 runs driven in. He has seven stolen bases on the season and is hitting .360 against right handed pitching. He is hitting .313 with a runners in scoring position on the year.

WILLIAMSON TELL OVERTURE

Outfielder **Caleb Williamson** (Sr./Baxter Springs, Kan.) is hitting .291 this season in 43 appearances including 32 starts for the Hornets. He has a .282 batting average this season when runners are in scoring position and .302 with two outs.

ST. FRANCIS

Outfielder **Jeremy Francis** (Jr./Emporia, Kan.) is hitting .345 with three home runs and 42 RBI. He has 17 stolen bases for ESU this year and his steal of home against UNO in the regular season gave ESU the lead for good. He is hitting .388 when runners are on base this season. He is currently sixth in the MIAA in runs scored and ninth in stolen bases.

MULBERRY LANE

Outfielder **Kellen Lane** (Sr./Borger, Texas) is hitting .280 on the year with 25 RBI and three stolen bases. He has now made 31 starts this season with most of them coming in right field or at designated hitter against right-handed pitching.

ON THE MARC

Designated hitter **Marc Albers** (Jr./Lawrence, Kan.) had his first career home run against Washburn to tie the game. He is hitting .288 on the season starting 12 games at DH primarily against left handed pitchers. He is hitting .333 against left-handed pitchers this season. He has a .424 slugging percentage on the season.

RYAN EXPRESS

Lefthander **Ryan Anthony** (Sr./Overland Park, Kan.) was named Second Team All-Region. He was named second team All-MIAA. He picked up his first complete game and first shutout of the season in the Hornets 10-0 win over Fort Hays State. He earned his second complete game win with a 2-1 victory against Central Missouri. He added another complete game shut-out against SBU on May 2nd. He is 8-3 on the year with a 3.38 ERA. Opposing hitters are only hitting .228 against him through 15 appearances. Anthony is only allowing left handed hitters to hit .223 against him this season. He is currently fifth in the MIAA in wins and second in opponent batting average. He is seventh in the MIAA in ERA and second in shut-outs and fifth in strikeouts.

JOHNNY APPLEHANS

Lefthander **Tyler Applehans** (Sr./Fredonia, Kan.) was named second team All-MIAA this season. He was the first Hornets pitcher to earn MIAA Athlete of the Week honors. He had a career high 17 strikeouts against TSU. He is 7-4 for the Hornets this season with a 3.50 ERA and is allowing hitters only a .219 average against him this season. He is eighth in the MIAA in wins this season. He is leading the MIAA in strikeouts and is fifth in the league in opponent batting average. He was a unanimous first team All-MIAA pitcher during the 2008 season.

BIG BEN

Righthander **Ben Graham** (Jr./Holden, Mo.) scattered ten hits over 6.0 innings with four strike outs and no walks against UNO on Saturday. He gave up two runs in 5.1 innings of relief against UCM in the MIAA Tournament. He earned his third complete game win against Fort Hays State on March 13. He pitched his second complete game of the season in the win against Northwest Missouri. He threw the Hornets first complete game of the season in a 6-1 win over Colorado Mines. He is now 7-3 on the year with a 3.78 ERA. He has 61 strikeouts this season while only giving up nine walks. He is striking out 6.78 batters for every walk he has allowed this season. Teams have only stolen five bases out of nine attempts with him on the mound. He is eighth in the MIAA in earned run average.

COLBY JACK

Righthander **Colby Killian** (Jr./McMinnville, Tenn.) scattered four hits over six innings in the opener against Angelo State. He is now 6-0 and has 71 strikeouts in 67.0 innings pitched this season. He is currently second on the team and fourth in the MIAA in strikeouts per game.

I'D LIKE SOME MOORE PLEASE

Righthander **Cole Moore** (Jr./Lee's Summit, Mo.) is 5-0 this season after picking up his fifth straight win with a 18-8 victory over Truman. He has a ERA of 4.97 on the season in 38.0 innings pitched.

KING OF TOWN

Righthander **Dominic King** (Fr./Wichita, Kan.) is now 4-0 on the season with a 3.96 ERA. He has pitched 36.1 innings in 20 appearances as a true freshman.

GO, DIEGO, GO

Righthander **Diego Soto** (Sr./Tucson, Ariz.) was named honorable mention All-MIAA. He leads the Hornets in appearances with 29 and has a 5-2 record with ten saves. He ranks 15th nationally in saves. He is allowing hitters a .246 batting average against him with a 3.03 ERA in 38.2 innings pitched. He is currently second in the MIAA in saves and second in appearances. He has 44 strikeouts and just 17 walks on the year.

EXTRA INNINGS

- The Hornets have scored 25 of their 42 runs in the regional with two outs.
- Since the NCAA went to six team regionals in 2006, twenty of the 24 regionals have been won by the team that started 2-0.
- The last nine teams to score 20 or more runs in a regional game have advanced to the NCAA Championship Series.
