PLAYING WITH THE BIG BOYS

Emporia State takes on Kansas in the Hornets 14th game against NCAA Division I opposition since coach Moe took over in 2001. In the last seven years ESU has played at Kansas, Gonzaga, Wichita State and Texas A & M. They will play three in total this season including a regular season match-up against Kansas State in Manhattan.

LAST TIME OUT

Emporia State used a 16-5 run to cut a Wichita State lead to six points, but the Shockers pulled away in the end for a 71-58 exhibition victory in Koch Arena in Wichita on Monday night. Lamar Wilbern led all scorers with 17 points and added nine rebounds for the Hornets. He was joined in double figures by Matt Boswell with 15 points and Robert Moores with ten. Wilbern came one rebound shy of a double-double with nine boards on the evening. Shang Ping and Jeremiah Box both added six points.

THE COACHES

David Moe is 114-87 in his seventh season at ESU and is 108-67 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and to five straight winning seasons. He has the fourth most wins of any men's coach in ESU history. His .567 winning percentage in seven seasons is second to Bill Hargiss in winning percentage of ESU coaches with at least four years of experience. He is 0-2 against KU in exhibition meetings against Bill Self of Kansas.

Bill Self is in his fifth year at Kansas and is 142-32 while coaching the Jayhawks. He is 349-137 in 15th season as a head coach.

SCOUTING THE JAYHAWKS

Kansas was the NCAA Division I National Champion last season and enter this season ranked #23 in the nation. Sherron Collins put up 22 points for the Jayhawks in the exhibition opener against Washburn. Cole Aldrich led the squad with nine rebounds in the game.

SERIES HISTORY

This will mark the 19th meeting between the two squads and fourth in exhibition play. ESU leads 13-3 in regular season match-ups and 3-0 in exhibition meetings.

RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS

The Hornets are 32-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. ESU led the MIAA in scoring at 83.7 points per game last year and were 15th in the nation. The Hornets have topped the century mark 22 times under David Moe, with 18 of the games coming in the last five seasons. ESU has three scorers in the leagues top 20 including the league's top scorer DeAndre Townsend who currently ranks 32nd.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

The Hornets will look to replace six seniors from last seasons roster. ESU returns only three players with starting experience from last season. ESU could feature as many as three newcomers in their opening day starting line-up.

UP NEXT

The Hornets will stay on the road for their season opener when they take on Eastern New Mexico in Portales, N.M. Tip-off is scheduled for 7 p.m. from Greyhound Arena.

AWAY FROM HOME

The Hornets will open the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and will not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa comes to White Auditorium. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home.

RECAPING 2007-08

The Hornets went 14-16 last season and entered the MIAA Tournament as the eighth seeded team. The Hornets pulled off the biggest upset in MIAA Championship history when they knocked off the #1 seeded Bearcats of Southwest Baptist. The Hornets Cinderella run ended in the Championship game against Northwest Missouri. The Hornets had six seniors on the squad and DeAndre Townsend was named first team All-MIAA. Wes Book along with Townsend finished their careers at Emporia State as members of the 1,000 point club.

SPENCER FOR HIRE

Guard Spencer Allen (Sr./Emporia, Kan.) grabbed two boards and had two assists against the Shockers. He enters his senior season for the Hornets as one only four Hornets who have seen time in the starting line-up. Last season he 1.7 points per game and 2.1 rebounds per game. On his career he is averaging 1.5 points per game and 1.5 rebounds per game in four seasons.

HIGH JUMPER

Guard Dustin Andres (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) pulled down one rebound and had one assist against WSU. He enters his third season with the Hornets basketball team. Last season Andrews averaged 2.3 points per game and 1.7 rebounds per game. In his career he is averaging 2.3 points per game and 1.4 rebounds per game. Last season he had a career high 11 points against Northwest Missouri on Feb. 7, 2008 also set a career high with four made field goals in that contest. Set a career high with six rebounds against Truman last season. Is also an All-American high jumper with the ESU track team.

TAKING IT TO THE MATT

Guard Matt Boswell (So./Wichita, Kan.) had 15 points including going three of five from behind the arc along with five rebounds against Wichita State. He will be beginning his second season with the Hornets. Last season he averaged 3.7 points per game to go along with 2.1 rebounds per game last season. Scored 10 points on three separate occasions for his career high during the 2007-08 campaign.

DOUG E. DOUG

Center Doug Moore (Jr./Wichita, Kan.) had four rebounds for ESU against the Shockers. He is entering his third season with the Hornets after playing in a career high 12 games last season. Averaged 0.7 points and 1.8 rebounds per game last season. In his career Moore is averaging 0.8 points per game and 1.5 rebounds per game.

FULL HOUSE

Forward Adam Holthaus (So./Wichita, Kan.) had four points and one rebound for the Hornets against WSU. He will return to the Hornets squad after redshirting last season. Entering this year he is averaging 1.3 points per game and 1.6 rebounds per game.

OUT ON THE MOORES

Guard Robert Moores (Jr./Elmhurst, Ill.) had ten points and one rebound against Wichita State. He enters his first season with the Hornets after transferring from the University of Albany. Last season he scored six points and pulled down four rebounds for the Great Danes. Prior to Albany he was at Pratt Community College where he averaged 13.9 points and 4.0 assists per game.

PING PONG

Center Shang Ping (Sr./Haerbin, China) had six points and three rebounds against the Shockers. He enters his first year with the Hornets after transferring from the University of Nebraska before this season. While playing for the Cornhuskers he averaged 3.0 points per game and 1.4 rebounds per game after appearing in 21 games and averaging 9.9 minutes per game in the season. Prior to playing for the Cornhuskers he played at Illinois Central Community College where he averaged 7.8 points per game and 4.1 rebounds per during his sophomore year. He was named a NJCAA Pre-Season All-American entering his sophomore season.

LAMAR, NEBRASKA

Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) led the team with 17 points and nine rebounds against the WSU. He is entering his first season after transferring from Hamilton College in Nebraska. While playing for the Aliens he averaged 23.2 points per game and 9.3 assists per game along with 7.6 rebounds per game. He was name First-Team All-Region in the NJCAA. He has a triple double against Jayhawk Conference's Hutchinson Community College.

BOXING DAY

Jeremiah Box (Jr./Rockford, Ill.) had six points and two rebounds against the Shockers. He is in his first season with the Hornets after transferring from Sauk Valley Community College. Was a honorable mention All-American for the Skyhawks during his sophomore year. Averaged 18.5 points per game last season for the NJCAA Division I squad.

NILES AND NILES OF REAL ESTATE

Guard Tim Niles (Jr./Brooklyn, N.Y.) is in his first season with the Hornets after transferring from College of the DuPage in Illinois. While playing for the Chaparrals he was named a NJCAA Division III All-American. He led the squad in scoring averaging 16.6 point per game a 4.0 assists per game. Scored 1,039 total points in his two-year career before coming to Emporia State.

PYLEING IT ON

Guard Alex Pyle (Sr./Towanda, Kan.) is in his second season with the Hornets after transferring from Barton County Community College. Last season averaged 1.3 points per game and 0.6 rebounds per contest in twelve games and one start last season. Had a career high seven points against Pittsburg State on Feb. 20, 2008.
