THINK I'LL GO TO JOPLIN

ESU will play two of their remaining four games on the road. They also conclude their second three-game road trip of the season when they travel to Joplin, Mo. to take on Missouri Southern. The Hornets entering the weekend set in fourth place in the MIAA standings behind SBU, UCM and FHSU.

LAST TIME OUT

Emporia State outscored #5 Southwest Baptist 48-42 in the second half, but it wasn't enough to overcome a 17 point halftime deficit in an 81-70 loss in Bolivar, Mo. Tim Niles led ESU with 18 points off the bench while Robert Moores added 15 and Lamar Wilbern chipped in 12 points. Wilbern and Jeremiah Box paced the team with five rebounds each in the ballgame.

THE COACHES

David Moe is 129-95 in his eighth season at ESU and is 120-76 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. He is the third winningest coach in ESU history behind Gus Fish and Ron Slaymaker. Moe is 7-8 against the Lions in his career. Robert Corn is 307-256 in 19 years at Missouri Southern. He is 11-16 in his career against the Hornets.

SCOUTING THE LIONS

Missouri Southern is 16-9 on the season and 6-9 in the MIAA. They are led by last season's Freshman of the Year Skyler Bowlin who is averaging 13.8 points per game on the season. On the DaRell Crittendon averaged 4.2 rebounds per game.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the 67th meeting between the two teams with Missouri Southern holding a 39-27 overall edge in the series. ESU won the earlier meeting this season in Emporia.

LAST TIME AGAINST SBU

Emporia State used a balanced attack as they upset then #12 Missouri Southern 71-66 on Jan. 7 in White Auditorium. For the Hornets it was their second win over a ranked opponent this season. Lamar Wilbern scored 17 points to lead the Hornets as nine players scored for ESU. Jeremiah Box joined Wilbern in double figures with 14 points while Matt Boswell and Shang Ping added eight points each.

UP NEXT

The Hornets will close out the season with two of their last three games at home. They will face Pittsburg State at home on Feb. 18 with a scheduled 7:30 p.m. tip-off from White Auditorium.

RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS

The Hornets are 37-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaging 83.8 points per game when playing at home this season.

AWAY FROM HOME

The Hornets opened the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and did not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa came to White Auditorium. The Hornets are 5-6 so far this season when playing away from Emporia. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home. The Hornets have two, three games road trips in MIAA schedule.

A DAY AT HOME

The Hornets have had seven straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season and including this season. The Hornets are 80-21 for a .802 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets are now 10-2 at home on the season with two wins over ranked opponents.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE

The Hornets currently rank second in the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .414 per game and are also second in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.6 on the year. They also rank third in overall field goal percentage.

ON THE DEFENSIVE

Emporia State is currently second in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .314 on the season. ESU also ranks fifth in the league in defensive rebounding. Lamar Wilbern ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds averaging 6.6 per contest.

LAMAR, NEBRASKA

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) had 20 points and 14 rebounds at UNO. He had a game high 16 points against #12 UCM. He had 13 points and had four rebounds against Truman. He scored 20 points and had a team high four assists at MWSU. He had nine rebounds at NWMSU. He had 12 points and six rebounds against FHSU. He scored 18 points against WU. He had a career high 27 points and 16 rebounds against PSU. He had a game high 21 points against #3 SBU. He had a double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against UNO. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against TSU. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He recorded a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at UCM. He had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU. He leads the Hornets with 15.7 points while he leads ESU at 7.6 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 147 defensive rebounds this year 88 more than any other player. He had 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is third in overall rebounding. He is currently seventh in scoring.

BOXING DAY

Forward Jeremiah Box (Jr./Rockford, Ill.) had ten against MWSU. He had 12 points against NWMSU. He had 12 points against FHSU. He scored 13 points against WU. He had 14 points against #12 MSSU. He had 14 points and eight rebounds against UNO. He had a game high 20 points against Central Christian. He had 15 points and a career high three blocks against MWSU. He scored 22 points against Ottawa. He is averaging 11.0 points per game. He had a career high 28 points at ENMU.
