### CAN'T WAIT TO BE ON THE.....

The Hornets will continue their road trip on Saturday, Jan. 24 at Northwest Missouri. The Hornets, along with the #5 Lady Hornets currently have the eighth best overall (men and women) combined record in the nation. The two teams have combined to go 28-6 through the first 34 games this season.

### LAST TIME OUT

Emporia State held Ft. Hays State to one field goal in the final 6:30 but the Tigers converted 13 of 16 free throws in the final 4:21 to secure a 78-68 win on Wednesday night in Hays, Kan. All nine Hornets that played scored led by Tim Niles 14 points off the bench. Adam Holthaus added 13 points for the Hornets.

### THE COACHES

David Moe is 127-91 in his eighth season at ESU and is 118-72 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. He is the third winningest coach in ESU history behind Gus Fish and Ron Slaymaker. Moe is 4-13 against NWMSU in his career. Steve Tappmeyer is 404-202 in his sixth year as the head coach at Ft. Hays State. He is 13-4 in his career against Coach Moe. He is 21-12 against ESU in his career.

### SCOUTING THE BEARCATS

Northwest Missouri is 8-9 on the season and 3-7 in the MIAA and have won three of their last four games. They are led by Hunter Henry who comes in averaging 17.9 points and 9.1 rebounds per game. He is joined in double figures by Elijah Allen who is averaging 11.4 points per game this year.

### SERIES HISTORY

NWMSU leads the overall series 30-20 and have split with ESU over the last four games. The road team won both regular season meetings last year with ESU picking up their first win under Coach Moe in Bearcat Arena. ESU won the first half of the home and home series this year.

### LAST TIME AGAINST NWMSU

The Emporia State men used an 11-0 run to start the second half on their way to a 79-56 win over then #21 Northwest Missouri in White Auditorium. Robert Moores had 22 points and six assists to pace ESU.

### UP NEXT

ESU will close out their road trip at Missouri Western on Jan. 28 before back to back home dates. Tip-off in St. Joseph, Mo. is set for 7:30 p.m. Following that match-up they return home to face Truman and Central Missouri in White Auditorium.

***RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS***

The Hornets are 36-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaging 87.5 points per game when playing at home this season.

***AWAY FROM HOME***

The Hornets opened the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and did not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa came to White Auditorium. The Hornets are 4-3 so far this season when playing away from Emporia. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home. The Hornets have two, three games road trips in MIAA schedule.

***A DAY AT HOME***

The Hornets have had seven straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season and including this season. The Hornets are 79-21 for a .790 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets have opened the season 9-1 and with a win over then #12 MSSU.

***THAT'S OFFENSIVE***

The Hornets currently rank second in the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .414 per game and are also second in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.7 on the year. ESU currently ranks third in the league in scoring margin.

***ON THE DEFENSIVE***

Emporia State is currently second in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .290 on the season. The Hornets rank fourth overall in rebounding margin. ESU also ranks third in the league in defensive rebounding. Lamar Wilbern ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds averaging 6.7 per contest.

***LAMAR, NEBRASKA***

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) had 12 points and six rebounds against FHSU. He scored 18 points against WU. He had a career high 27 points and 16 rebounds against PSU. He had 17 against #12 MSSU. He had a game high 21 points against #3 SBU. He had a double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against UNO. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against TSU. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He recorded a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at UCM. He had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU. He leads the Hornets with 16.1 points while he leads ESU at 7.9 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 113 defensive rebounds this year 51 more than any other player. He had 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is third in overall rebounding. He is currently sixth in scoring.

***BOXING DAY***

Forward Jeremiah Box (Jr./Rockford, Ill.) had 12 points against FHSU. He scored 13 points against WU. He had 14 points against #12 MSSU. He had 14 points and eight rebounds against UNO. He had a game high 20 points against Central Christian. He had 15 points and a career high three blocks against MWSU. He scored 22 points against Ottawa. He is third on the team in scoring on the season averaging 12.1 points per game. He had a career high 28 points at ENMU. He is currently eighth in the MIAA in three-pointers made while he is ranked seventh in the league in three point percentage at .402 on the year on 82 attempts. He is 19th in the league in scoring.

Guard Robert Moores (Jr./Elmhurst, Ill.) scored 15 against WU. He had 17 points against PSU. He had ten points against #3 SBU. He scored 12 points against UNO. He had a game high 19 points at TSU. He had 12 points against Bethany. He had his first double-double against Central Christian with 17 points and 10 assists. He had 20 points and four assists against MWSU. He had a career high 23 points against then #21 NWMSU. He is averaging 13.9 points per game and is shooting .506 from the field this year. He is shooting .507 from the 3-pt. line in 73 attempts on the season. He scored a game high 20 points against Benedictine at home. He currently ranks sixth in the MIAA in made three-pointers per game and is first in the league in three-point percentage. He ranks 13th in the league in scoring this season. He had a career high seven rebounds to go along with 15 points against Newman. He had 16 points in the season opener against Eastern Mexico.

**HIGH JUMPER**

He had a career high 14 points against Central Christian. He had six points and four assists against MWSU. He had eight points and a career high three steals as ESU beat NWMSU. He had six points to go along with a career high six assists in the Hornets win over Benedictine. He is averaging 8.9 points per game this year. He had 13 points against Ottawa.

**FULL HOUSE**

Forward Adam Holthaus (So./Wichita, Kan.) scored in double figures for the third straight game with 13 points against FHSU. He scored 10 points in the win over Washburn.
