GOING ON THE ROAD

The Hornets will play four of their next five games on the road with their one home game being the Turnpike Tussle. ESU will travel to Pittsburg State on Jan. 10 to face the Gorillas. The Hornets will look to move above .500 on the road in the MIAA.

LAST TIME OUT

Emporia State used a balanced attack as they upset #12 Missouri Southern 71-66 on Wednesday night in White Auditorium. For the Hornets it was their second win over a ranked opponent this season. Lamar Wilbern scored 17 points to lead the Hornets as nine players scored for ESU. Jeremiah Box scored 14 points and added a career high five steals in the game for ESU. Wilbern and Box also paced the Hornets with five rebounds apiece.

THE COACHES

David Moe is 125-90 in his eighth season at ESU and is 116-71 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. His .576 winning percentage in seven seasons is third in winning percentage of ESU coaches with at least four years of experience. Gene Iba is 249-143 in 13 years at PSU and 475-346 in 28 years overall.

SCOUTING THE GORILLAS

Pittsburg State is 7-6 on the season with a 2-4 record in MIAA play. They are led by their guard play with all three averaging in double figures. Carlos Taylor averages 17.3 points, Spencer Magana with 12.3 points and Ivan Evans with 10.0 points per game. TJ Stukes is the teams leading rebounder averaging 7.7 per contest this year.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the 175th meeting between the two squads with ESU holding an 88-86 overall edge.

LAST TIME AGAINST PSU

After falling behind 31-9 to start the game, Emporia State battled back to pull within five points to start the second half, but couldn't complete the comeback in an 88-71 loss at Pittsburg State. With the loss ESU drops to eighth in the MIAA with a two game lead over Truman for the final spot in the MIAA Tournament. Wes Book had 18 points to lead ESU on the night while DeAndre Townsend and Caleb Tegtmeier each added 15 points.

UP NEXT

ESU will return home for the Turnpike Tussle on Jan. 17 in White Auditorium. Tip-off for the match-up is scheduled for 7:30 p.m.

RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS

The Hornets are 35-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaging 87.5 points per game when playing at home this season.

AWAY FROM HOME

The Hornets opened the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and did not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa came to White Auditorium. The Hornets are 3-2 so far this season when playing away from Emporia. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home. The Hornets have two, three games road trips in MIAA schedule.

A DAY AT HOME

The Hornets have had six straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season. The Hornets are 78-21 for a .788 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets have opened the season 8-1 and with the win over #21 MSSU secured a seventh straight winning season at home.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE

The Hornets currently rank third in the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .410 per game and are also second in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.1 on the year. ESU currently ranks fourth in the league in scoring margin and are third in field goal percentage.

ON THE DEFENSIVE

Emporia State is currently third in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .294 on the season. The Hornets rank fourth overall in scoring defense. ESU also ranks fifth in the league in defensive rebounding. Lamar Wilbern ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds averaging 6.3 per contest.

LAMAR, NEBRASKA

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) had 17 against #12 MSSU. He had a game high 21 points against #3 SBU. He had his second straight double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against UNO. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against Truman. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He had his second career double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at UCM. He had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU. He is the Hornets second leading scorer on the season with 15.3 points while he leads ESU at 7.7 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 84 defensive rebounds this year 47 more than any other player. He had a career high 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is fifth in overall rebounding. He is currently eighth in the MIAA in scoring.

BOXING DAY

Forward Jeremiah Box (Jr./Rockford, Ill.) had 14 points against #12 MSSU. He had 14 points and eight rebounds against UNO. He scored 11 points against Bethany. He had a game high 20 points against Central Christian. He had 15 points and a career high three blocks against MWSU. He scored 22 points against Ottawa. He is third on the team in scoring on the season averaging 12.4 points per game. He had a career high 28 points at ENMU. He is currently eighth in the MIAA in three-pointers made averaging 2.0 per contest while he is ranked seventh in the league in three point percentage at .431 on the year on 65 attempts. He is 18th in the league in scoring.

OUT ON THE MOORES

Guard Robert Moores (Jr./Elmhurst, Ill.) had ten points against #3 SBU. He scored 12 points against Nebraska-Omaha. He had a game high 19 points at TSU. He had 12 points against Bethany. He had his first double-double against Central Christian with 17 points and 10 assists. He had 20 points and four assists against MWSU. He had a career high 23 points against then #21 NWMSU. He is averaging 14.0 points per game and is shooting .514 from the field this year. He is shooting .516 from the 3-pt. line in 62 attempts on the season. He scored a game high 20 points against Benedictine at home. He currently ranks fifth in the MIAA in made three-pointers per game and is first in the league in three-point percentage. He ranks 13th in the league in scoring this season. He had a career high seven rebounds to go along with 15 points against Newman. He led the Hornets with 12 against the KSU Wildcats. He had 16 points in the season opener against Eastern Mexico.

PING PONG

Center Shang Ping (Sr./Haerbin, China) had eight points against #12 MSSU. He had eight points and six rebounds against #3 Southwest Baptist. He had eight points against UNO. He had nine points and tied a career high with nine boards against Bethany. He had seven points and five rebounds against UCM. He had nine points against MWSU. He had ten points and four rebounds against then #21 NWMSU. He had a career high 19 points and nine rebounds in ESU's home win over Benedictine. He is averaging 7.5 points and 4.6 rebounds in six starts for the Hornets this season.

HIGH JUMPER

Guard Dustin Andrews (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) was two of two from the field with five points against #12 MSSU. He had a career high 13 points against #3 SBU. He tied a career high with 11 points against Truman. He had a game high two assists against UCM. He had seven points and four rebounds against Central Christian. He had nine points and six assists against Missouri Western. He had four points and two rebounds for the Hornets in their upset of then #21 NWMSU. He had seven points to go along with a career high seven assists in ESU's win over Benedictine. He is averaging 5.9 points and 2.1 rebounds per game in nine starts. He had a career high eight rebounds against Newman.

NILES AND NILES OF REAL ESTATE

Guard Tim Niles (Jr./Brooklyn, N.Y.) had six points against #12 MSSU. He had a career high 16 points and eight rebounds against UNO. He was four of four from the charity stripe at TSU. He had ten points against Bethany. He had 12 points against Central Missouri. He had a career high 14 points against Central Christian. He had six points and four assists against MWSU. He had eight points and a career high three steals as ESU beat NWMSU. He had six points to go along with a career high six assists in the Hornets win over Benedictine. He is third on the team in assists this season averaging 2.8 per game while averaging 8.3 points per game this year. He had 13 points against Ottawa.

FULL HOUSE

Forward Adam Holthaus (So./Wichita, Kan.) had six points and four boards against #12 MSSU. He had four points and five boards against #3 SBU. He had a career high 14 points against UNO. He made his first career start at TSU. He had 10 points against Bethany. He had four rebounds against UCM. He had eight points and a game high six rebounds against MWSU. He had nine points and eight rebounds as the Hornets against then #21 NWMSU, while hitting a career high five free throws. He is averaging 6.1 points and 4.8 rebounds per game this season. He had 10 points and a career high nine rebounds against K-State.

TAKING IT TO THE MATT

Guard Matt Boswell (So./Wichita, Kan.) had eight points against #12 Missouri Southern. He has started eight games for the Hornets this season. He is averaging 3.0 points and 2.6 boards this season. He led the Hornets with six rebounds in the season opener.
