A BOLIVAR TUESDAY

ESU will make their first road trip to face a ranked opponent this season on Tuesday, Feb. 7. Coming into this game ESU is 2-2 against ranked foes with all those games coming at White Auditorium. ESU is now 5-5 away from home this season and have moved to 3-4 away from home in MIAA play.

LAST TIME OUT

Lamar Wilbern had 20 points and 14 rebounds as Emporia State overcame an 11 point deficit with 8:58 left in a 91-85 win at Neb.-Omaha on Saturday in Omaha, Neb. Wilbern led five Hornets in double figures. Rogert Moores had 19 points, Tim Niles and Adam Holthaus each had 13 points, and Dustin Andrews added ten points. Jordan Stout had a career high eight points in the game.

THE COACHES

David Moe is 129-94 in his eighth season at ESU and is 120-75 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. He is the third winningest coach in ESU history behind Gus Fish and Ron Slaymaker. Moe is 8-7 in his career against SBU.

Jeff Guiot is 99-41 in five years at SBU and 317-134 overall in 14 years. He is 6-4 in his career against ESU.

SCOUTING THE BEARCATS

The Southwest Baptist Bearcats are 18-3 on the season and 11-3 in the MIAA and are ranked #6 in the NABC Poll. They are led by two-time MIAA Player of the Week Matt Rogers who is averaging 19.3 points and 8.1 rebounds per game. D'Ante Harris averages 15.2 points per game for SBU this season.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the 37th meeting between the two squads with each team earning a win over the last two meetings. SBU won the earlier match-up this season in Emporia.

LAST TIME AGAINST SBU

Emporia State's Lamar Wilbern scored 21 points but ESU could not overcome seven Bearcats in double figures in a 104-69 Southwest Baptist victory in White Auditorium. Dustin Andrews added 13 points for ESU in the game and was joined by Robert Moores who added 10 points. SBU was led by Nick Kovacevich with 16 points as seven Bearcats reached double figures.

UP NEXT

The Hornets will continue their road trip when they travel to Missouri Southern on Feb. 14. They will then return home to face Pittsburg State on Feb. 28 in White Auditorium.

RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS

The Hornets are 37-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaging 83.8 points per game when playing at home this season.

AWAY FROM HOME

The Hornets opened the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and did not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa came to White Auditorium. The Hornets are 5-5 so far this season when playing away from Emporia. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home. The Hornets have two, three games road trips in MIAA schedule.

A DAY AT HOME

The Hornets have had seven straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season and including this season. The Hornets are 80-21 for a .802 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets are now 10-2 at home on the season with two wins over ranked opponents.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE

The Hornets currently rank second in the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .414 per game and are also second in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.6 on the year. They also rank third in overall field goal percentage.

ON THE DEFENSIVE

Emporia State is currently second in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .314 on the season. ESU also ranks fifth in the league in defensive rebounding. Lamar Wilbern ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds averaging 6.6 per contest.

LAMAR, NEBRASKA

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) had 20 points and 14 rebounds at UNO. He had a game high 16 points against #12 UCM. He had 13 points and had four rebounds against Truman. He scored 20 points and had a team high four assists at MWSU. He had nine rebounds at NWMSU. He had 12 points and six rebounds against FHSU. He scored 18 points against WU. He had a career high 27 points and 16 rebounds against PSU. He had a game high 21 points against #3 SBU. He had a double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against UNO. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against TSU. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He recorded a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at UCM. He had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU. He leads the Hornets with 15.7 points while he leads ESU at 7.4 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 131 defensive rebounds this year 74 more than any other player. He had 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is third in overall rebounding. He is currently seventh in scoring.

BOXING DAY

Forward Jeremiah Box (Jr./Rockford, Ill.) had ten against MWSU. He had 12 points against NWMSU. He had 12 points against FHSU. He scored 13 points against WU. He had 14 points against #12 MSSU. He had 14 points and eight rebounds against UNO. He had a game high 20 points against Central Christian. He had 15 points and a career high three blocks against MWSU. He scored 22 points against Ottawa. He is averaging 11.5 points per game. He had a career high 28 points at ENMU.

He is shooting .525 from the 3-pt. line in 101 attempts on the season. He scored a game high 20 points against Benedictine at home.
