TURNPIKE TUSSLE PART DUEX

The Hornets will travel to Topeka on Feb. 25 to face Washburn in the second leg of the Turnpike Tussle. The Hornets have won six of seven in the series and hold a one game edge going into the 190th meeting between the two squads. ESU clinched a spot in the MIAA tournament on Saturday.

LAST TIME OUT

Lamar Wilbern had 19 points, nine rebounds and seven assists as Emporia State knocked off Pittsburg State 84-74 in White Auditorium. The Hornets hit nine of ten three pointers in the second half on the way to their 16th win of the year. Wilbern was joined in double figures by Adam Holthaus with 19 points and eight rebounds, while Tim Niles had 13 points and Robert Moores added 12 points.

THE COACHES

David Moe is 130-96 in his eighth season at ESU and is 121-77 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. He is the third winningest coach in ESU history behind Gus Fish and Ron Slaymaker. Moe is 8-8 against WU in his career. Bob Chipman is 663-263 in his 30th year as the head coach at Washburn. Chipman is 44-19 against ESU in his career.

SCOUTING THE ICHABODS

Washburn is 15-11 overall and 11-8 in the MIAA this season. They are led on the floor by DeAndre Eggins who comes into the contest averaging 16.3 points and 5.6 rebounds per game. He is joined by Lehkeythan Malone who averages 11.8 points and 5.8 rebounds per game. Darnell Kimble averages 12.3 points per game off the bench for the Ichabods this season.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the 190th meeting between the two teams with ESU now holding a 95-94 advantage in the overall series. The Hornets have won six of the last seven in the series.

LAST TIME AGAINST WU

Emporia State closed the game on a 16-4 run in the final 2:56 to pull out an 85-75 win over Washburn in White Auditorium. Dustin Andrews had a career high 19 points to lead five Hornets in double figures.

UP NEXT

The Hornets will return to White Auditorium for their final regular season game against Fort Hays State on Feb. 28. Seniors Spencer Allen, Shang Ping and Alex Pyle will be recognized prior to tip off which is scheduled to tip at 7:30 p.m. from W. L. White Auditorium.

RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS

The Hornets are 37-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaging 83.9 points per game when playing at home this season.

AWAY FROM HOME

The Hornets opened the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and did not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa came to White Auditorium. The Hornets are 5-7 so far this season when playing away from Emporia. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home.

A DAY AT HOME

The Hornets have had seven straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season and including this season. The Hornets are 81-21 for a .794 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets are now 11-2 at home on the season with two wins over ranked opponents.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE

The Hornets currently rank second in the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .421 per game and are also second in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.8 on the year. They also rank third in overall field goal percentage.

ON THE DEFENSIVE

Emporia State is currently second in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .322 on the season. They are fifth in defensive rebounds.

LAMAR, NEBRASKA

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) had 19 points, nine rebounds and seven assists against PSU. He had 20 points and 14 rebounds at UNO. He had a game high 16 points against #12 UCM. He scored 20 points at MWSU. He had nine rebounds at NWMSU. He had 12 points and six rebounds against FHSU. He scored 18 points against WU. He had a career high 27 points and 16 rebounds against PSU. He had a game high 21 points against #3 SBU. He had a double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against UNO. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against TSU. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He recorded a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at UCM. He had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU. He leads the Hornets with 15.4 points while he leads ESU at 7.5 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 158 defensive rebounds this year 89 more than any other player. He had 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is fourth in overall rebounding. He is currently ninth in scoring.

HIGH JUMPER

Guard Dustin Andrews (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) led ESU with five assists against MSSU. He had ten points against UNO. He had eight points against Truman. He had a career high 19 points against WU. He had seven points in a four overtime win at PSU. He had a career high 13 points against #3 SBU. He tied a career high with 11 points against TSU. He had a game high two assists against UCM. He had seven points and four rebounds against Central Christian. He had nine points and six assists against MWSU.. He had seven points to go along with a career high seven assists in ESU's win over Benedictine. He is averaging 6.0 points and 2.2 rebounds per game in nine starts. He had a career high eight rebounds against Newman.
