### MID WEEK MATCH-UP

Emporia State will face Central Christian College in their final home tune-up before starting conference road games. ESU is riding a four game home winning streak this season entering the game.

### LAST TIME OUT

Emporia State outscored Missouri Western 51-25 in the first half and held on for an 88-77 win on Saturday night in White Auditorium. Lamar Wilbern had 19 points, five rebounds and five assists and Robert Moores had a game high 20 points for the Hornets. Jeremiah Box joined them in double figures with 15 points in the game. ESU shot .621 on the night while the Griffons shot .456. Missouri Western shot .600 as they attempted to come from behind in the second half.

### THE COACHES

David Moe is 120-88 in his eighth season at ESU and is 113-69 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. His .577 winning percentage in seven seasons is third in winning percentage of ESU coaches with at least four years of experience.

Matt O' Brien is 26-40 in his third season with the Tigers.

### SCOUTING THE TIGERS

Central Christian is 5-5 on the season and currently on a two game winning streak. CCC is led by Patrick Green who averages 14.3 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Jordan Crawford averages 10.8 points and 8.9 rebounds per game off the bench. Early season leading scorer Sean High has missed three games with an injury.

### SERIES HISTORY

This will be the second meeting between the two squads with ESU winning the only other meeting in 1999.

### LAST TIME AGAINST CCC

Emporia State scored 61 points in the first half on their way to a 116-63 victory on Nov. 23, 1999. David Peoples led all scorers in the game with 21 points while Raymond Briggs had a double-double with 11 points and ten rebounds. Bennie Theriot had 20 points for ESU in the win. Five Hornets finished in double figures as ESU shot .570 on the night. Matthew Turner was the leading scorer for the Tigers finishing the game with 20 points.

### UP NEXT

The Hornets will travel to Central Missouri on Dec. 13 in Warrensburg, Mo. Tip-off is scheduled for 8:00 p.m. from the Multipurpose Building.

***RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS***

The Hornets are 34-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaig 88.7 points per game at home this year.

***AWAY FROM HOME***

The Hornets opened the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and did not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa came to White Auditorium. The Hornets are 2-1 so far this season when playing away from Emporia with their only loss coming to Division I Kansas State. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home. The Hornets have two, three games road trips in MIAA. The Hornets first road date in MIAA play will be on Dec. 13 when they face Central Missouri in Warrensburg, Mo.

***A DAY AT HOME***

The Hornets have had six straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season. The Hornets are 75-20 for a .883 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets have opened the season 4-0 at home including an upset win over then #21 Northwest Missouri.

***THAT'S OFFENSIVE***

The Hornets currently rank third in the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .417 per game and are also third in three-pointers made per game averaging 9.0 on the year. The Hornets are the only MIAA team with three players ranked in the top 15 in individual scoring. The Hornets rank second in the league in assists this season.

***ON THE DEFENSIVE***

Emporia State is currently leading the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .259 on the season. ESU also ranks third in the league in defensive rebounding on the year. Lamar Wilbern ranks second in the MIAA in defensive rebounds averaging 5.3 per contest.

***OUT ON THE MOORES***

Guard Robert Moores (Jr./Elmhurst, Ill.) had 20 points and four assists against MWSU. He had a career high 23 points against then #21 NWMSU. He is averaging 16.3 points per game and is shooting .579 from the field this year. He is shooting .528 from the 3-pt. line in 36 attempts on the season. He is the Hornets leading scorer despite not starting a game. He scored a game high 20 points against Benedictine at home. He currently ranks fourth in the MIAA in made three-pointers per game and is second in the league in three-point percentage. He ranks fifth in the league in scoring this season. He has been in double figures scoring for the Hornets in six of seven contests so far. He had a career high seven rebounds to go along with 15 points against Newman. He led the Hornets with 12 against the KSU Wildcats. He had 16 points in the season opener for the Hornets on four of five shooting from the three point line against Eastern Mexico.

***BOXING DAY***

Forward Jeremiah Box (Jr./Rockford, Ill.) had 15 points and a career high three blocks against MWSU. He had 11 points and five assists against then #21 NWMSU. He had 13 points for the Hornets against Benedictine. He scored 22 points against Ottawa and went five of five from the free-throw line. He is second on the team in scoring on the season averaging 14.7 points per game. He had 28 points at ENMU along with six assists. He is currently fifth in the MIAA in three-pointers made averaging 2.6 per contest while he is ranked seventh in the league in three point percentage at .462 on the year on 39 attempts. He is 10th in the league in scoring this season.

**LAMAR, NEBRASKA**

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU along with six defensive rebounds. He is the Hornets third leading scorer on the season with 14.1 points while he leads ESU at 6.6 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 37 defensive rebounds on the season, 13 more than any other player. He scored nine points and had eight rebounds against Benedictine. He had a career high 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds while going eight of ten from the line. He had 10 points and five rebounds against KSU. He ranks second in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is sixth in the in overall rebounding. He is currently 15th in the MIAA in scoring and seventh in assists.

**PING PONG**

Center Shang Ping (Sr./Haerbin, China) had nine points against MWSU. He had ten points and four rebounds against then #21 NWMSU. He had a career high 19 points and nine rebounds in ESU's home win over Benedictine. He is averaging 8.0 points and 4.7 rebounds in six starts for the Hornets this season. He had six points and four rebounds against Ottawa. He had a career high seven rebounds against Newman. He had nine points and four rebounds in the season opener.

**NILES AND NILES OF REAL ESTATE**

Guard Tim Niles (Jr./Brooklyn, N.Y.) had six points and four assists against MWSU. He had eight points and a career high three steals as ESU upset then #21 NWMSU. He had six points to go along with a career high six assists in the Hornets win over Benedictine. He is fourth on the squad in assists this season averaging 3.0 per game while averaging 7.0 points per game this year. He had a career high 13 points against Ottawa. He was four of five shooting with eight points and two steals along with two assists Newman.

**HIGH JUMPER**

Guard Dustin Andrews (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) had nine points and six assists against Missouri Western. He had four points and two rebounds for the Hornets in their upset of then #21 NWMSU. He had seven points to go along with a career high seven assists in ESU's win over Benedictine. He is third on the team averaging 3.3 assists per game this year. He is averaging 6.0 points and 2.7 rebounds per game in five starts for Emporia State this season. He was two of three from 3-pt. land against Ottawa. He had a career high eight rebounds against Newman. He led the Hornets with five assists against Kansas State. He had three points, three rebounds and three assists in the season opener.

**TAKING IT TO THE MATT**

Guard Matt Boswell (So./Wichita, Kan.) had started all seven games for the Hornets this season. He broke a regular season three-point field goal drought that lasted 27 games with a three against Ottawa. He is averaging 3.9 points and 3.3 boards this season. He led the Hornets with six rebounds in the season opener. He averaged 11.0 points and 2.5 rebounds per game during the exhibitions for the Hornets and led ESU against WSU with 15 points.

**FULL HOUSE**

Forward Adam Holthaus (So./Wichita, Kan.) had eight points and a game high six rebounds against MWSU. He had nine points and eight rebounds as the Hornets upset then #21 Northwest Missouri. He hit a career high five free throws in the contest for the Hornets. He is a perfect 13 of 15 from the charity stripe and leads the team with an .867 free throw percentage on the season. He had four points and three rebounds against the Ravens. He is averaging 5.9 points and 5.6 rebounds per game this season. He had six points and four rebounds against Newman. He had a career high 10 points and nine rebounds against KSU.

Guard Spencer Allen (Sr./Emporia, Kan.) tied a career high with eight points and three made field goals in the ESU's win over Benedictine. He had four points and three boards against Ottawa. He is averaging 1.7 rebounds per game along with 2.0 points per game. He had three rebounds and three assists in the season opener. He is one of only three Hornet seniors this season.

**QUAIL MAN**

Center Doug Moore (Jr./Wichita, Kan.) had a career high nine rebounds against Benedictine. He is averaging 2.0 points per game and 3.0 rebounds per game on the season. He averaged four rebounds per game in exhibition play. He is in his third season with the Hornets after playing in a career high 12 games last season.

**PYLEING IT ON**

Guard Alex Pyle (Sr./Towanda, Kan.) returned to the line-up against NWMSU after missing two games with a foot injury. He had five points and three rebounds against Eastern New Mexico. He had what would have been a career high 13 points against KU in the exhibition. He was an All-American in the high jump for the track team.
