SENIOR DAY

The Hornets will play their final regular season game against Fort Hays State at home. It will be Senior Day and prior to the game Shang Ping, Alex Pyle and Spencer Allen will be honored. In the MIAA standings the Hornets will finish in fourth in the league with a loss and with a win they will finish in third in the league.

LAST TIME OUT

Emporia State jumped out to a 6-1 lead and never trailed on their way to a 78-63 victory over Washburn in Lee Arena. The Hornets got 21 points each from Jeremiah Box and Robert Moores and Lamar Wilbern added 19 points. Box also finished with a team high eight rebounds while Moores finished with a team high seven assists.

THE COACHES

David Moe is 131-96 in his eighth season at ESU and is 122-77 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. He is the third winningest coach in ESU history behind Gus Fish and Ron Slaymaker. Moe is 4-5 in his career against FHSU. Mark Johnson is 155-73 in his sixth year as the head coach at Ft. Hays State. Johnson is 3-4 against ESU in his career.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

Fort Hays State is 19-7 on the year and 12-7 in the MIAA. They are led by Tyrone Evans who averages 13.0 points per game and Terry Jefferies who averages 11.2 points per game. They are led on the glass by Tim Painter who averages 7.3 boards per contest. FHSU has four of their five starters scoring in double figures this season.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the 165th meeting between the two squads with the Tigers holding the overall advantage 83-81. The Hornets have won three of the last five including two straight at home.

LAST TIME AGAINST FHSU

Emporia State held Ft. Hays State to one field goal in the final 6:30 but the Tigers converted 13 of 16 free throws in the final 4:21 to secure a 78-68 win on Wednesday night in Hays, Kan. All nine Hornets that played scored led by Tim Niles 14 points off the bench. Adam Holthaus added 13 points for the Hornets.

UP NEXT

If the Hornet men win on Saturday they will be the third seed and play at approximately 8:15 p.m. on Thursday. If ESU loses we will be fourth and play at approximately 4:15 p.m. on Thursday.

RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS

The Hornets are 37-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaging 83.9 points per game when playing at home this season.

REGIONALLY SPEAKING

This season the MIAA as a conference is 65-15 against non-conference opponents. They have gone 32-11 against teams in division II and are 14-7 against teams in the region. ESU is the only team to win on the road against a lone start opponent and a Heartland opponent this season.

A DAY AT HOME

The Hornets have had seven straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season and including this season. The Hornets are 81-21 for a .794 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets are now 11-2 at home on the season with two wins over ranked opponents.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE

The Hornets currently lead the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .422 per game and are also second in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.9 on the year. They also rank third in overall field goal percentage.

ON THE DEFENSIVE

Emporia State is currently second in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .319 on the season. They are fifth in scoring defense.

LAMAR, NEBRASKA

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) scored 19 points for the Hornets against Washburn. He had 19 points, nine rebounds and seven assists against PSU. He had 20 points and 14 rebounds at UNO. He had a game high 16 points against #12 UCM. He scored 20 points at MWSU. He had nine rebounds at NWMSU. He had 12 points and six rebounds against FHSU. He scored 18 points against WU. He had a career high 27 points and 16 rebounds against PSU. He had a game high 21 points against #3 SBU. He had a double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against UNO. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against TSU. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He recorded a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at UCM. He had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU. He leads the Hornets with 15.5 points while he leads ESU at 7.3 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 161 defensive rebounds this year 90 more than any other player. He had 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He ranks second in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is fourth in overall rebounding. He is currently ninth in scoring.

HIGH JUMPER

Guard Dustin Andrews (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) had five rebounds for the Hornets against Washburn. He led ESU with five assists against MSSU. He had ten points against UNO. He had eight points against Truman. He had a career high 19 points against WU. He had seven points in a four overtime win at PSU. He had a career high 13 points against #3 SBU. He tied a career high with 11 points against TSU. He had a game high two assists against UCM. He had seven points and four rebounds against Central Christian. He had nine points and six assists against MWSU.. He had seven points to go along with a career high seven assists in ESU's win over Benedictine. He is averaging 5.8 points and 2.3 rebounds per game in nine starts. He had a career high eight rebounds against Newman.
