WELCOME BACK HORNETS

The Hornets will return to Emporia after their second three game road trip of the season to play two of their final three games at home. ESU will face Pittsburg State on Feb. 18 before taking the Turnpike Tussle on the road to Topeka, Kan. ESU is 10-2 this season when playing at home this season.

LAST TIME OUT

The Emporia State men built a 23 point lead at the 16:56 mark of the second half only to see Missouri Southern go on an 23-3 run over the next 10:26 on the way to a 77-71 MSSU victory in Joplin, Mo. on Saturday night. Tim Niles led ESU in scoring with 22 points, including a career high five three pointers, and Robert Moores added 20 points with four treys. Adam Holthaus added 12 points.

THE COACHES

David Moe is 129-96 in his eighth season at ESU and is 120-77 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. He is the third winningest coach in ESU history behind Gus Fish and Ron Slaymaker. Moe is 7-8 against PSU in his career. Gene Iba is 252-150 at PSU in 13 years and is 478-353 in 28 years overall. He is 17-8 in his career against the Hornets.

SCOUTING THE GORILLAS

Pittsburg State is 10-13 on the season with a 5-11 record in MIAA play. They are led by their guard play with two averaging in double figures. Carlos Taylor averages 17.3 points and Spencer Magana adds 12.0 points per game. Rodney Grace now averages 10.2 points and 5.5 rebounds per game. TJ Stukes is the teams leading rebounder averaging 7.8 per contest this year.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the 176th meeting between the two squads with ESU holding an 89-86 overall edge. ESU snapped a three-game losing streak in the series with their four overtime win earlier this year.

LAST TIME AGAINST PSU

Lamar Wilbern had 27 points and 16 rebounds as Emporia State defeated Pittsburg State 102-100 in an MIAA record tying four overtimes in Pittsburg, Kan. Adam Holthaus had a career high 19 points as ESU's bench outscored PSU's 52-5 on the night.

UP NEXT

The Hornets will go on the road for the Turnpike Tussle in Topeka on Feb. 25. They will then return home for their regular season finale and Senior Night on Feb. 28 against Fort Hays State.

RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS

The Hornets are 37-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaging 83.8 points per game when playing at home this season.

AWAY FROM HOME

The Hornets opened the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and did not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa came to White Auditorium. The Hornets are 5-7 so far this season when playing away from Emporia. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home.

A DAY AT HOME

The Hornets have had seven straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season and including this season. The Hornets are 80-21 for a .802 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets are now 10-2 at home on the season with two wins over ranked opponents.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE

The Hornets currently rank second in the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .418 per game and are also second in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.8 on the year. They also rank third in overall field goal percentage.

ON THE DEFENSIVE

Emporia State is currently second in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .315 on the season. They are fifth in defensive rebounds.

LAMAR, NEBRASKA

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) had 20 points and 14 rebounds at UNO. He had a game high 16 points against #12 UCM. He had 13 points and had four rebounds against Truman. He scored 20 points and had a team high four assists at MWSU. He had nine rebounds at NWMSU. He had 12 points and six rebounds against FHSU. He scored 18 points against WU. He had a career high 27 points and 16 rebounds against PSU. He had a game high 21 points against #3 SBU. He had a double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against UNO. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against TSU. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He recorded a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at UCM. He had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU. He leads the Hornets with 15.3 points while he leads ESU at 7.5 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 151 defensive rebounds this year 88 more than any other player. He had 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is fourth in overall rebounding. He is currently seventh in scoring.

HIGH JUMPER

Guard Dustin Andrews (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) led ESU with five assists against MSSU. He had ten points against UNO. He had eight points against Truman. He had a career high 19 points against WU. He had seven points in a four overtime win at PSU. He had a career high 13 points against #3 SBU. He tied a career high with 11 points against TSU. He had a game high two assists against UCM. He had seven points and four rebounds against Central Christian. He had nine points and six assists against MWSU.. He had seven points to go along with a career high seven assists in ESU's win over Benedictine. He is averaging 6.1 points and 2.0 rebounds per game in nine starts. He had a career high eight rebounds against Newman.
