### **SUPER SUNDAY**

Before the Steelers and Cardinals get going in Tampa on Sunday the Hornets will kick off the day in the afternoon with a home game against Truman. ESU played one regular season Sunday game last year defeating Missouri Western in overtime by a score of 65-62. They also played in the MIAA Tourney Championship on a Sunday last year.

### **LAST TIME OUT**

Emporia State was outrebounded by 16 as they fell to Missouri Western 75-58 on Wednesday night in St. Joseph, Mo. Lamar Wilbern led ESU with 20 points and five rebounds and was joined in double figures by Jeremiah Box with ten points. Adam Holthaus led the squad on the boards pulling down six rebounds on the night.

### **THE COACHES**

David Moe is 127-93 in his eighth season at ESU and is 118-74 since 2002. He has led ESU to appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and 2007 and winning seasons in four of the last five years. He is the third winningest coach in ESU history behind Gus Fish and Ron Slaymaker. Moe is 11-4 in his career against TSU. Jack Schrader is 153-225 in 14 years coaching at Truman State. He is 8-16 overall against the Hornets in his career.

### **SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS**

Truman is 6-13 on the year and 1-11 in the MIAA. They are led in scoring by Banks Estridge who enters the contest averaging 10.5 point and 4.8 rebounds per game. Inside they look to Ethan Freeman who comes in averaging 9.8 points and 6.6 rebounds per contest.

### **SERIES HISTORY**

This will be the 34th meeting between the two squads with ESU holding a 21-12 overall edge. The Hornets took the first meeting this year by a 63-58 score on the road. ESU has won three straight in the series six of the last ten overall.

### **LAST TIME AGAINST TSU**

Robert Moores scored 19 points including a clutch three pointer with 14.7 seconds left as Emporia State pulled out a 63-58 road win at Truman. Lamar Wilbern had 13 points and 12 rebounds for his third double-double of the season for the Hornets. Dustin Andrews tied his career high with 11 points to join them in double figures.

### **UP NEXT**

ESU will stay at home for a quick turnaround when they face Central Missouri on Feb. 4. Tip-off for the match-up is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. frn W. L. White Auditorium.

***RUNNING WITH THE HORNETS***

The Hornets are 36-10 since 2002-03 when reaching the 90 point plateau. The Hornets were third in the MIAA in scoring last season and led the MIAA in scoring in 2006 and 2007. ESU has led the MIAA in scoring in four of the last six seasons. ESU is averaging 87.5 points per game when playing at home this season.

***AWAY FROM HOME***

The Hornets opened the season with their first five games (two exhibition + three regular season) on the road and did not play at home for the first time until Nov. 25 when Ottawa came to White Auditorium. The Hornets are 4-5 so far this season when playing away from Emporia. Last season the Hornets opened with five straight at home, though they did take their longest road trip since joining the NCAA last season as they played six games spanning 32 days away from home. The Hornets have two, three games road trips in MIAA schedule.

***A DAY AT HOME***

The Hornets have had seven straight winning seasons in White Auditorium dating back to the 2002-03 season and including this season. The Hornets are 79-21 for a .790 winning percentage in White Auditorium over the last seven seasons. The Hornets have opened the season 9-1 and with a win over then #12 MSSU.

***THAT'S OFFENSIVE***

The Hornets currently rank second in the MIAA in three-point shooting percentage averaging .411 per game and are also second in three-pointers made per game averaging 8.5 on the year. They also rank third in overall field goal percentage.

***ON THE DEFENSIVE***

Emporia State is currently second in the MIAA in three-point percentage defense only allowing opponents .299 on the season. ESU also ranks third in the league in defensive rebounding. Lamar Wilbern ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds averaging 6.5 per contest.

***LAMAR, NEBRASKA***

Guard Lamar Wilbern (Jr./Milwaukee, Wis.) scored 20 points and had a team high four assists at MWSU. He had nine rebounds at NWMSU. He had 12 points and six rebounds against FHSU. He scored 18 points against WU. He had a career high 27 points and 16 rebounds against PSU. He had 17 against #12 MSSU. He had a game high 21 points against #3 SBU. He had a double-double with 22 points and ten rebounds against UNO. He had a double-double with 13 points and 12 rebounds against TSU. He had a game high 20 points against Bethany. He recorded a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds at UCM. He had 19 points and five assists against MWSU. He scored 14 points against then #21 NWMSU. He leads the Hornets with 15.8 points while he leads ESU at 7.8 boards per game. He leads the Hornets with 124 defensive rebounds this year 69 more than any other player. He had 22 points for the Hornets against Ottawa. He had his first career double-double against Newman scoring 18 points and pulling down 12 rebounds. He ranks first in the MIAA in defensive rebounds this season and is third in overall rebounding. He is currently seventh in scoring.

***BOXING DAY***

Forward Jeremiah Box (Jr./Rockford, Ill.) had ten against MWSU. He had 12 points against NWMSU. He had 12 points against FHSU. He scored 13 points against WU. He had 14 points against #12 MSSU. He had 14 points and eight rebounds against UNO. He had a game high 20 points against Central Christian. He had 15 points and a career high three blocks against MWSU. He scored 22 points against Ottawa. He is averaging 11.9 points per game. He had a career high 28 points at ENMU. He is currently ninth in the MIAA in three-pointers made and is tenth in 3-pt. percentage.

Guard Robert Moores (Jr./Elmhurst, Ill.) had 19 points against NWMSU. He scored 15 against WU. He had 17 points against PSU. He had ten points against #3 SBU. He had a game high 19 points at TSU. He had 12 points against Bethany. He had his first double-double against Central Christian with 17 points and 10 assists. He had 20 points and four assists against MWSU. He had a career high 23 points against then #21 NWMSU. He is averaging 13.8 points per game and is shooting .495 from the field this year. He is shooting .494 from the 3-pt. line in 87 attempts on the season. He scored a game high 20 points against Benedictine at home. He currently ranks sixth in the MIAA in made three-pointers per game and is first in the league in three-point percentage. He ranks 13th in the league in scoring this season.
