DOG FIGHT

The #19 Lady Hornets will wrap-up a three game home stand when they take on the Truman Bulldogs in White Auditorium. ESU and TSU have three common opponents. ESU is 3-0 in those games while TSU is 2-1 with the loss coming at FHSU

LAST TIMEOUT

The #16 Lady Hornets hit their first nine shots from the field and never looked back in a 92-62 win over Pittsburg State in White Auditorium. ESU finished the night shooting .530 while holding the Gorillas to just .316 shooting from the field. After being held to three points in the first half, ESU All-American **Michelle Stueve** ended with 19 points to become just the second Lady Hornet to score 2,000 points in her career. **Ida Edwards** added a double-double for the Lady Hornets with 11 points and ten rebounds. Stueve and Edwards were joined in double figures by **Andrea Leiker** with 15, **Allie Renberg** with 13 and **Cassandra Boston** with 11 points.

THE COACHES

Brandon Schneider is 236-57 (.805) in his tenth year as head coach. He is the winningest coach in Lady Hornet history and is responsible for over one third of ESU's all-time victories. He is the third winningest active coach by percentage in Division II and is the only coach in MIAA history with an .800 winning percentage and at least 200 wins. The Lady Hornets have gone to the NCAA Tournament in eight of his nine seasons as head coach. He is 32-21 against Top 25 teams in his career and has three wins against #1 ranked teams. He is 17-2 against TSU.

John Sloop is 82-120 in his eighth year at TSU. He is 1-13 against ESU.

SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

Truman is off to one of the best starts in school history at 11-2 overall and 3-1 in the MIAA. The Bulldogs are leading the MIAA in steals and scoring margin. Georgia Mueller is the second leading scorer and rebounder in the MIAA at 21.8 points and 9.3 rebounds per game.

THE SERIES

The Lady Hornets lead the all-time series 32-5 and have won 11 straight in the series. ESU is 19-1 against TSU in White Auditorium with the lone win coming on Feb. 12, 1994. The last Bulldog win over the Lady Hornets was a 64-57 victory in Kirksville on Jan. 12, 2003. ESU and TSU played for the 1999 NCAA South Central Regional championship with the Lady Hornets winning 110-93 in White Auditorium. Since then ESU is 205-54 and TSU is 98-129 overall.

LAST TIME AGAINST TSU

After falling behind 10-2 to start the game, the #11 Lady Hornets went on a 26-9 run to take the lead in a 77-62 win over Truman in White Auditorium. **Andrea Leiker** scored 17 to lead ESU and was joined in double figures by **Michelle Stueve** with 16 points and seven boards. **Genae Glasper** had eight points on four of four shooting and a career high 13 rebounds. ESU shot .548 and out rebounded the TSU 23 to 15 in the first as they pulled away to a 47-26 half time advantage.

UP NEXT

The #19 Lady Hornets are on the road for an afternoon affair at Central Missouri. Tip-off from the Multipurpose Building is set for 1:30 p.m. There are a limited number of seats still available on a ESU Fan Bus to Warrensburg. Contact the Athletic Development Office for more information.

WHERE THEY'RE AT

The Lady Hornets are leading the MIAA in three-point field goal percentage, rebounding, opponents rebounding, rebound margin, and made three pointers and are second in scoring, field goal percentage, three-point field goal percentage defense and blocked shots. A Lady Hornet is ranked in the top four of the league in scoring, rebounding, assists, assist to turnover ratio, field goal percentage, free throw percentage, three-point percentage, and made three-pointers.

ROAD WARRIORS

ESU is 108-44 (.711) away from home and 35-14 (.714) in neutral site games under Schneider with three of the losses in the Elite Eight. ESU is 67-22 (.753) on the road in MIAA league play since 1997-98.

HOME COOKIN'

Emporia State has won 150 of their last 163 games at home. They have only lost eight games to unranked NCAA teams in White Auditorium since 1997. ESU has not lost consecutive home games since Feb. 7-10, 1996. The Lady Hornets are 303-81 (.789) overall since 1979 at home and holds the MIAA record for consecutive home wins with 62 set from 1997-2001.

BRING IT ON

The Lady Hornets are 38-24 against Top 25 teams since 1997-98. White Auditorium has been especially tough on ranked foes, with the Lady Hornets going 17-5 at home against NCAA Division II Top 25 teams since 1997. Four of the five losses are to teams ranked in the top four at the time. ESU is 13-8 in neutral site games with top 25 foes since 1997. The Lady Hornets have nine wins against Top 10 teams, including three against #1 teams in the last three seasons.

BY THE NUMBERS

The Lady Hornets have topped the 100-point barrier 37 times since Brandon Schneider became head coach. Since 1997-98, the Lady Hornets are 172-1 when scoring at least 80 points. The one loss was to North Dakota, 87-81 in the 1999 Final Four. ESU is second in the MIAA in scoring and scored a league high 111 points against Central Methodist. ESU topped the 100 point mark three times last year.



STUEVE WONDER

Michelle Stueve (Sr./Olpe, Kan.) has been named All-American twice by both the WBCA and Daktronics. She was a unanimous first-team All-MIAA selection and a first-team Daktronics All-Region pick for the second straight year last season. She has been MIAA Player of the Week twice this year and ten times in her career. **She is seventh in the nation in scoring and eighth in the nation in made three's. She leads the MIAA in scoring and is second in made three-pointers and three-point percentage, third in rebounding, fourth in field goal percentage and tenth in free throw percentage.**

She became the second Lady Hornet to eclipse 2,000 career points during her 19 point night against PSU. She had her second straight double-double and fifth on the season with 19 points and 10 rebounds against WU. She led ESU with 15 points and 13 rebounds at SBU. She had 20 points at FHSU including the first ten and last seven points of the game for ESU. She was named to the Hoop'n'Surf All-Tourney team after leading the classic in scoring. She had 27 points and six boards at Cameron. She scored 24 points with 12 rebounds and tied her career high with seven made three-pointers against Central Oklahoma. She started the season with a double-double of 23 points and 10 boards with five assists against Cameron. She scored 19 points with nine rebounds at Kansas.

She was named MIAA Player of the Week for an MIAA high four times last year. She scored 18 points in the second half of ESU's win over then #3 Washburn in front of a national television audience. She scored 26 points and pulled down 17 boards in ESU's win over then #2 Missouri Western in White Auditorium. She had 28 points and 18 rebounds against Southwest Baptist and the 18 boards were the most in a game by an MIAA player last year. She registered a double-double with 18 points and 13 rebounds in ESU's 64-59 win over Kansas State in exhibition action.

As a sophomore she scored 40 points with 11 rebounds against American International and was named to the NCAA Elite Eight All-Tournament team. She was the Most Outstanding Player at the South Central Regional after averaging 30.7 points in the three games. She broke the ESU record for most points in an NCAA tournament game with 41 against West Texas A&M. She was featured in the Jan. 30, 2006 edition of Sports Illustrated "Faces in the Crowd" section. She had 21 rebounds against then #4 Shaw. The 21 rebounds are tied for eighth in MIAA single game history.

She is the ESU leader in made three pointers with 242 makes in 109 games. She is second in career scoring at ESU and eighth in the MIAA with 2,016 points. She is fourth in career rebounding at ESU and seventh in the MIAA with 890 boards. She needs 144 to break the MIAA career scoring record.

She became the first Lady Hornet to be named a Kodak All-American as a sophomore and her 777 points in 2005-06 are the second most in ESU and MIAA history. She was the 2005 MIAA Freshman of the Year.

She is a career 20.6 point per game scorer in the NCAA Tournament and has averaged 33.0 points over her last five games in the "Big Dance."

In the classroom, Stueve was an ESPN The Magazine First-Team Academic All-District performer last year and has earned Academic All-MIAA honors her first three years and is a multiple member of the MIAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll and the ESU Athletic Director's Honor Roll.

YAZOO SERIOUS

Ida Edwards (Jr./Yazoo City, Miss.) had her second double-double in MIAA play with 11 points and 10 rebounds off the bench against PSU. She scored ten points with eight rebounds and three blocks against WU. She had 14 points and nine rebounds at SBU. She had her first double-double with 17 points and ten rebounds at Ft. Hays State. She also had two blocks and two steals against the Tigers in Hays. She had 19 points and eight boards against OPSU after scoring eight points with eight boards against Shaw. She has had at least eight rebounds in every game she has played this season. She made her first start against Shaw after sitting out due to NCAA transfer guidelines. She was an all-conference performer for Pensacola CC and was named to the Florida Panhandle All-Star Team. She was the Mississippi Class 4A Player of the Year for Yazoo City HS in 2003.

BOSTON POPS

Cassandra Boston (So./Des Moines, Iowa) is leading the MIAA in three-point field goal percentage. She has reached double figures in each of her last three games after playing just 24 minutes in the previous six games due to an ankle injury suffered against Evangel. She had 16 points, six assists and three steals against Texas Woman's University. She set the ESU single game record with nine made three pointers against Cameron. She finished with a career high 34 points on nine of ten shooting from behind the arc against the Aggies. She scored 29 points with four steals against KU.



She was named the 2007 MIAA Freshman of the Year. She scored a then career high 20 points in ESU's nationally televised win over #3 Washburn. She had 11 points with two steals against then #2 Missouri Western. She scored ESU's final nine points at Northwest Missouri and ended with a game high 17 points and four steals. She tied her career high with eight assists against NWMSU in White Auditorium. She had a game high 19 points at Washburn.

She was the top scoring freshman in the MIAA last season and ranks third all-time among freshmen at ESU with 362 points. She had a game-high 21 points in ESU's exhibition win over Kansas State and was a perfect 10 for 10 at the charity stripe against the Wildcats.

I LEIKER HER LIKE THAT

Andrea Leiker (Jr./Lyons, Kan.) had 15 points and two steals against Pitt State. She is shooting .563 from three point land in MIAA play. She scored 14 points on a four of six effort from the arc against SBU. She scored a season high 16 points against Shaw with three assists. She scored 15 points against Central Methodist with five assists and five rebounds. She had 13 points on five of eight shooting against Evangel. She scored 14 points in the second half against Central Oklahoma. She scored 11 points with six assists against Texas Woman's. She is second in the MIAA in free throw percentage at .848 and had a string of 19 straight broken at FHSU. She is also third in the league in three-point percentage. She scored 14 points with an eight of nine performance from the free throw line against Washburn in White Auditorium. She scored a career high 22 points against then #2 Missouri Western with three treys and seven of 11 shooting from the field. She scored 18 points with five rebounds against Northwest Missouri. She had a career high nine rebounds at Truman. She scored 17 points on six of seven shooting from the field against FHSU with a career best five three pointers last season.

RENBURG THE REBOUNDER

Allie Renberg (Jr./Sleepy Eye, Minn.) scored 13 points with eight rebounds against Pitt State. She had six points, six rebounds and three blocked shots in her second career start against WU. She scored ten points at SBU and has reached double figures in seven games this year. She had 18 points and 11 rebounds against OPSU for her third double double in four games. She was named MIAA Player of the Week after she had a career high 26 points with 12 rebounds against Central Methodist for her second straight double-double. She had her first career double-double with ten points and ten rebounds against Harris-Stowe. She scored 16 points on six of nine shooting with five rebounds off the bench against Evangel. She had ten points and nine rebounds at Cameron. She scored 19 points with a game high nine rebounds against Texas Woman's on seven of ten shooting from the field. She had a career high 13 rebounds and two blocks against Cameron. She is sixth in the MIAA in rebounding, 17th in scoring, fourth in free throw percentage and eighth in blocked shots. She is a transfer from Iowa Lakes CC where she earned third-team NJCAA All-American honors after averaging 15.3 rebounds and 8.8 boards per game. She averaged 17 points and 9 rebounds for Sleepy Eye HS.

ITS A BREEZE

Bree Kisner (Fr./Independence, Mo.) had seven points, five rebounds and three assists against Pitt State in her first career start. She is shooting .583 from the field and .667 from behind the arc over the last five games. She had two blocked shots in six minutes at FHSU. She scored a career high ten points with a career high seven assists against Central Methodist. She had five rebounds against HSSU. She scored nine points with four assists and two steals while playing four positions against Evangel. She had a career high five rebounds against Central Oklahoma. She had four rebounds at KU and was credited with a block. She averaged 16.9 points, 6.6 assists and 5.1 rebounds per game for William Chrisman HS and was a three-time all-league performer for the Bears.

Alli Volkens (Fr./Reinbeck, Iowa) is shooting .571 from the field over the last six games despite going zero for four against PSU. She had a career high 24 points and nine rebounds against Shaw. She had 17 points and seven rebounds against Central Methodist. She had a career high four blocked shots against Evangel. She had two blocked shots against Texas Woman's in her first career start. She is sixth in the MIAA in blocked shots and is now averaging 1.23 blocks per game. She had nine points and six rebounds off the bench in her collegiate debut against Cameron. She had 14 points and six rebounds against Tabor. She also had two assists, three steals and a block against the Blue Jays. She had a game high 11 boards at KU and just missed a double double with nine points. She averaged 19.8 points and 11 rebounds with 3.2 blocks a game for Gladbrook-Reinbeck HS. She was a four-time all-conference performer for the Lady Rebels and was a two-time all-state performer.

CORKED BAT

Lacy Corker (So./Shawnee, Kan.) had eight assists against Pitt State. She is second in the MIAA in assists and is fourth in assist to turnover ratio. She scored a season high seven points at FHSU to go with six assists off the bench. She had a career high nine assists against Shaw with only three turnovers. She had seven assists and no turnovers against Central Methodist. She had eight assists along with five rebounds against Evangel. She was credited with four assists against Central Oklahoma. Last year she scored six points and tied her career high with five rebounds in the MIAA first round win over Central Missouri. She tied her career high with five boards against Truman. She dished six assists against UCM and scored six points on two of two shooting from the field and free throw line. She had a career high 11 points and five rebounds at Missouri Southern. She was four of seven from the field and three of three from behind the arc against the Lions. She had a team high five assists against St. Gregory's in her first career start. She had four assists, a steal and no turnovers against Metro State. She had 11 points and was perfect behind the arc with a pair of treys against Southwestern Oklahoma.

ST. AUGUSTYN

Jamie Augustyn (So./Burlington, Kan) tied her season highs with six points and two assists against Pittsburg State. She had five points against Shaw. She had five points, two assists and two rebounds against Central Methodist. She had three rebounds at Cameron and was credited with two assists and two rebounds against Central Oklahoma. She scored a career high 15 points on five of seven shooting from the field with a pair of treys in her first career start against St. Gregory's last year.

MINK COAT

Becky Zabel (Jr./Onaga, Kan.) had three rebounds in five minutes against WU. She pulled down a career high six rebounds at FHSU, all in the first half. She scored seven points with four rebounds and three assists at Cameron. She transferred to ESU from Cloud County CC. She averaged 8.8 points, 7.4 rebounds and 2.6 assists per game at Cloud County CC. She was an all-state performer for Onaga HS.

UNCOMMON VALOR

Tina Commons (Jr./Emporia, Kan.) sat out the PSU game with an illness. She tied her career high with six points on a pair of three pointers against Central Methodist. She had a career high six points against Cal. State-Stanislaus last season.

NIGHTMARE ON COMMERCIAL STREET

Kayla Krueger (Fr./Olpe, Kan.) had two rebounds against Pittsburg State. She saw her first regular season action against Central Methodist. She earned all-state honors for Olpe HS and was the MVP of the Emporia Gazette All-Area team.

MILLER TIME

Brittney Miller (Fr./Paola, Kan.) injured her ACL against Central Methodist and is out for the year. She earned her first start against Evangel and pulled down a career high seven rebounds and had three steals against the Crusaders. She had six points and five rebounds against Central Oklahoma. She scored six points on three of three shooting in six minutes against Texas Woman's in her Lady Hornet debut. She averaged 2.67 kills per game on .318 hitting for the #16 ESU volleyball team. She was named Miss Kansas Basketball in 2006-07 by the KBCA. She averaged 20.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 4.7 steals per game for Paola HS.

TUCK AND RUN

Jessen Tucker (Fr./Cedar Vale, Kan.) will red-shirt for the Lady Hornets this season. She was an all-state performer for Sedan HS and scored 1,087 points in her career for the Blue Devils.

RANKINGS

The Lady Hornets are currently ranked #19 in the ESPN/USA Today/WBCA Coaches Poll and were ranked #3 in the 2007-08 Preseason Poll. This is the 64th straight week and 134th week overall that ESU has been in the Coaches Top 25 since first appearing in the 1997-98 preseason poll. ESU was last ranked #1 in the Nov. 28, 2006 poll after opening at #3 in the 2006-07 Preseason Poll. This marks the 11th straight year the Lady Hornets have been nationally ranked. ESU was ranked #1 in the Jan. 11, 2005 poll, the first time the Lady Hornets have achieved the top ranking in NCAA Division II Basketball.

EXCELLENCE

The Lady Hornets opened the 2007-08 season ranked #3 in the ESPN/USA Today/WBCA Coaches Poll and are currently #19. It is the fourth straight year ESU has opened the season in the top ten and the Lady Hornets have spent 102 polls in the top ten since 1997-98. Prior to the Jan. 24, 2007 poll, when they dropped to #11, the Lady Hornets had been in the top ten for 27 straight polls over three years. After advancing to the Elite Eight for the fourth time in eight years in 2006, ESU opened the 2006-07 season with a #3 preseason ranking in the USA Today/WBCA Coaches Poll. It was the highest preseason ranking ever for the Lady Hornets by the WBCA. The Lady Hornets have been ranked in the WBCA Top 25 in each of the last 11 seasons and have received votes in 144 of 148 polls during that time. ESU has a streak of 12 straight winning seasons, second only to Missouri Western in the MIAA.

ABOUT THE REGION

There were five South Central Region teams ranked in the preseason top 20. South Central Region teams have advanced to the NCAA Division II Championship Game on eight occasions including three of the last six years (Southeastern Oklahoma State in 2002, Drury in 2004 and Washburn in 2005). Four of the eight teams have come from the MIAA, including Emporia State who lost the 1998 title game to North Dakota 92-76 in Pine Bluff, Ark. Two MIAA teams have won national championships, Central Missouri in 1984 and WU in 2005.

GIVE IT UP

The Lady Hornets had 31 assists against Central Methodist and are averaging 17.85 per game. ESU was second in the MIAA with 16.86 assists per game last season with a season high 32 against Mo. Valley. The school record for 30+ assist games is seven set in 1998-99 as ESU advanced to the Final Four in Brandon Schneider's first season as head coach. The Lady Hornets led the MIAA in assists with 20.7 per game in 2005-06. The Lady Hornets tied their own MIAA record with 37 assists against West Virginia Tech in Lee Arena in 2005-06. That mark ranks fifth all-time in NCAA Division II history for team single game assists.

HERE THEY COME

ESU has played in front of at least 1,000 fans in White Auditorium in every home game since January 2, 1999 - a span of 137 games. The 3,987 fans at the WU game were an MIAA high so far this season. The Lady Hornets averaged 2,420 fans over 14 home games last season to rank second in the nation. ESU averaged 2,875 in league games. ESU had an MIAA season high 4,642 fans for their nationally televised game against Washburn. They are one of the best road draws in the MIAA as well, averaging 1,718 fans for their nine league road dates last year. The Lady Hornets averaged a school record 2,684 fans over 13 home dates in 2005-06 to finish third in the nation and led the nation with an average attendance of 2,348 fans for their 15 home dates in 2004-05. Emporia State has been in the top six of the nation in attendance in each of the last ten years.

TOUGH ENOUGH

The MIAA has opened the season 67-22 against non-conference foes this season, with a 20-8 mark against the rest of the South Central Region. Two MIAA teams are currently ranked in the WBCA Top 25 with two more receiving votes. A total of four teams have spent at least one week in the Top 25 and five have received votes this year. The MIAA was 78-14 (.848) against outside competition last season. All ten teams in the league have a winning percentage of over .600 outside the league since the beginning of the 1999-2000 season.

LADY HORNET SUCCESS ON THE COURT...

The Lady Hornets have the best record in MIAA play in the 21st century. ESU is 113-33 (.774) in MIAA play since the 2000 season and 206-54 (.792) overall in that time. The Lady Hornets dominance increases if you add two more years to the equation. Since the 1997-98 season, ESU is 144-34 (.809) in MIAA play and 269-58 (.823) overall. ESU has won five MIAA Championships and made six trips to the Regional Championship, or "Sweet 16", and four trips to the Elite Eight in the last nine years. The Lady Hornets are the only team to win four straight undisputed (untied regular season and tournament) MIAA Championships pulling the trick from 1998-2001.

...AND IN THE CLASSROOM

ESU had a cumulative team GPA of 3.43 during the fall 2007 semester. Casey Henningsen and Michelle Stueve were both named ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VII last season. Stueve has a 3.68 GPA in biology and Henningsen held a 3.74 GPA in secondary education. Stueve, Henningsen, and Cassandra Boston were all named Academic All-MIAA last season.

Aneta Kausaite, Jurgita Kausaite, Tara Holloway-Churchill and Emily Bloss-Carpenter have had their jerseys retired in White Auditorium after earning All-American honors at Emporia State, after graduating from ESU and playing at least two years for the Lady Hornets.

ALL-TIME ALL-MIAA TOURNAMENT TEAM

Lady Hornets Emily Bloss, Tara Holloway and Jurgita Kausaite have been named to the ten person All-Time All-MIAA Tournament Team by a panel of past and current sports information directors and media members. Bloss averaged 17 points in her twelve tournament games, including a tournament record 76 points as a senior. Holloway is fifth in all-time tournament scoring 151 points in her career. Kausaite scored 120 points in six tournament games.

END GAME

The Lady Hornets are 80-2 when leading at the 5:00 mark since the start of the 2004-05 season and are 247-8 since 1997 with a lead at the 5:00 mark.

ALL AROUND PROGRAM

Both the Emporia State men and women were ranked in their respective top 25 coaches polls until the men fell out last week. In addition the ESU volleyball team was ranked #15 in the final AVCA poll and the ESU baseball team is #18 in the ABCA Preseason Poll and the women's tennis team is ranked #24 in the ITA Fall rankings.

CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE

The Lady Hornets have made ten trips to the NCAA Tournament in the last 11 years and they have won four NCAA South Central Regional Championships to advance to the Elite Eight. They have won five MIAA regular season championships, four MIAA tournament championships and four NCAA South Central Regional championships since 1997.

- The Lady Hornets have won 20 games ten times in the last 11 years and 15 times in the program's 32 year history.
- The Lady Hornets have won 25 games seven times in school history, six times in the last nine years.
- The Lady Hornets are 636-321 (.664) overall in 32 years of action.

- The Lady Hornets have had six of the last 11 MIAA MVPs (Kristie McClain-2003, Emily Bloss-2001, Tara Holloway-2000, Jurgita Kausaite-1999, Aneta Kausaite-1998, 1997) and three of the last six Freshmen of the Year (Nicole Patry-2002, Michelle Stueve-2005, Cassandra Boston-2007).
- The Lady Hornets 21-8 (.724) record is the best in MIAA Tournament history.
- The Lady Hornets 17 wins in NCAA Tournament action is tied for 11th all-time among active members at the Division II level despite only being a member of the Division for 15 years.
