HOMESTAND

The Hornets will play two of their final three home games in the next week. ESU will first face Northwest Missouri before welcoming Washburn for the Turnpike Tussle. ESU will then close out the season with six of their last seven games on the road.

THE COACHES

Jim Schneiderhahn is 6-42-1 in his third year at ESU and 45-84-7 in his eighth year as a head coach. He came to ESU after serving as an assistant coach at Tulane University. He was the head coach at Benedictine from 2000-04. He holds a United State Soccer Federation (USSF) National "A" Coaching License.

Tracy Hoza is 34-59-11 in her sixth season with the Bearcats.

LAST TIME OUT

The Hornet soccer team held the #20 Mavericks scoreless for the final 81 minutes of the game after two early goals. The Hornets could not manage to get on the board though falling 2-0. The Mavs goals came in the 1st and 8th minutes in the game. Kelsey Cowan had the Hornets lone shot on goal.

SCOUTING THE MAVERICKS

Northwest Missouri is 7-4-0 on the season and are 3-4-0 in the MIAA this season. Andrea Tritz and Holly Ramaeker lead the Bearcats this season as each has five goals and two assists good for 12 points. Kelsey Sanders also had two goals including the game winner against then #4 Nebraska-Omaha. Kira Lazenby has a 0.82 goals against average between the pipes this season.

LAST TIME AGAINST UNO

The Hornets shut out an opposing team for the longest time period of the season as two late goals after the 85th minute gave Northwest Missouri at 2-0 win. The Hornets held the Bearcats scoreless through 86 minutes of play as Megan Martin had seven saves at the half. For the Hornets Amanda Miano got of the only shot of the evening.

UP NEXT

The Hornets will play Washburn in the Turnpike Tussle on Oct. 16. Kick-off is scheduled for 7 p.m. from the TRYSA Complex in Emporia. Following their match with Washburn the Hornets will close out their season by playing six of their final seven games on the road.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The Hornets feature nine new faces this season with five freshman starting the first game for the Hornets. The Hornets only have three seniors going into this season.

STILLMOCKING IT

Jennifer Stillmock (Fr. • Omaha, Neb.) is questionable for the NWMSU match. She is second in the MIAA in saves per match. She has started seven games in goal for the Hornets this season. She has 39 saves on the season and was the first goalkeeper to record wins in her first two career decisions since 2001 and first to win back to back games since 2005. Combined with Tina Commons for the first shut-out by a ESU since 2006 when they defeated Avila 3-0. She held the high-powered Truman offense, which entered the contest averaging 2.5 goals and 8.5 shots on goal, to one goal in only three attempts.

MISS SMITH GOES TO EMPORIA

Alicia Smith (Jr. • Salina, Kan.) is doubtful for the match with NWMSU. She now leads the Hornets with three goals on the season after scoring the Hornets only goal against Missouri Southern. She is leading the Hornets in shots taken with 29 on the season. She now also leads the Hornets in points with seven on the season after getting her first assist against Missouri Western. She also leads the Hornets in shots on goals with nine on the season.

MISS GERMANY

Alison Germany (Fr. • Spring, Texas) now leads the Hornets in assists with three on the season. She started the first game for the Hornets this season. She had a goal and an assist against Angelo State on Aug. 29. She has seven shots and six of them have been on goal.

MARSHLAND

Shelly Marsh (Sr. • Olathe, Kan.) got her first assist of the season against Rockhurst. She scored her first career game winning goal as she propelled ESU to a 1-0 win over East Central.

HOUSE OF COMMONS

Tina Commons (Sr. • Emporia, Kan.) scored her first goal of the season for the Hornets against Southwest Baptist. She was the first Hornet to be named MIAA Player of the Week since 2005. She got her first career win and shutout against Missouri Western. She is sixth in the MIAA in shut-outs this season after helping the Hornets shut out Missouri Western.

SARAH SILVERMAN PROGRAM

Sarah Anderson (Fr. • Overland Park, Kan.) scored her first career goal in the 51st minute of ESU's 2-1 win over Angelo State.

DON'T HAVE A COW-AN

Kelsey Cowan (Fr. • Olathe, Kan.) is tied with Alison Germany, Shelley Marsh, Alicia Smith and Amanda Miano for the lead in assists as each now have one.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN TIME

Lauren Cathey (So. • Fort Collins, Colo.) is probable for the game against NWMSU with an injury. She got her first goal of the season in the 79th minute to give the Hornets a 1-0 win over Missouri Western. She is now tied for the team lead with five shots on goal.
