HOMESTAND

The Hornets will play three straight at home in the TRYSA Complex over the next two weeks. Following that only one of their remaining seven matches will be played at home. The Hornets have had two homestands of four or more games this season.

THE COACHES

Jim Schneiderhahn is 6-41-1 in his third year at ESU and 45-84-7 in his eighth year as a head coach. He came to ESU after serving as an assistant coach at Tulane University. He was the head coach at Benedictine from 2000-04. He holds a United State Soccer Federation (USSF) National "A" Coaching License.

Dan Klosterman is 162-35-7 in his 10th season with the Lions.

LAST TIME OUT

The Hornet soccer team fell by a tally of 5-1 in their final game at ESU Pitch before playing the remainder of their home schedule at the TRYSA Complex. ESU got seven shots on goal and 13 shots total in the match. Alicia Smith scored the only Hornet goal in the 77th minute of a pass from Alison Germany.

SCOUTING THE MAVERICKS

Nebraska-Omaha is 6-2-0 on the season and are 4-2-0 in the MIAA this season. They are ranked #4 in the NCAA/Adidas Division II Poll. The Mavs are led by Casey Bigsby who has three goals and two assists for a team that has only allowed opponents to score seven goals through eight games. Lauren Fox is leading the way in goal allowing 0.77 goals per match this season with 5-2 record on the season between the pipes.

LAST TIME AGAINST UNO

Brandie Booth scored in the 70th minute to answer the Mavericks tally in the first frame and force overtime on Sept. 25, 2004. Erin Allen held Nebraska-Omaha off the scoreboard in the extra frames to preserve the tie. Allen came up with nine saves as the Mavs outshot the Hornets 12-2 on goal and 26-7 overall. Amber Hearrell got the lone Hornets assist in the match.

UP NEXT

The Hornets will stay at home for two more matches first on Oct. 11 at 2 p.m. against Northwest Missouri. They will then face Washburn at the TRYSA Complex at 7 p.m. on Oct. 16. They will then close out the season with six of seven on the road.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The Hornets feature nine new faces this season with five freshman starting the first game for the Hornets. The Hornets only have three seniors going into this season.

STILLMOCKING IT

Jennifer Stillmock (Fr. • Omaha, Neb.) is second in the MIAA in saves per match. She has started six games in goal for the Hornets this season. She has 39 saves on the season and was the first goalkeeper to record wins in her first two career decisions since 2001 and first to win back to back games since 2005. Combined with Tina Commons for the first shut-out by a ESU since 2006 when they defeated Avila 3-0. She held the high-powered Truman offense, which entered the contest averaging 2.5 goals and 8.5 shots on goal, to one goal and only three shots on goal.

MISS SMITH GOES TO EMPORIA

Alicia Smith (Jr. • Salina, Kan.) now leads the Hornets with three goals on the season after scoring the Hornets only goal against Missouri Southern. She got her third goal of the season against Missouri Southern. She is leading the Hornets in shots taken with 29 on the season. She now also leads the Hornets in points with seven on the season after getting her first assist against Missouri Western. She also leads the Hornets in shots on goals with nine on the season.

MISS GERMANY

Alison Germany (Fr. • Spring, Texas) nows leads the Hornets in assists with three on the season. She started the first game for the Hornets this season. She had a goal and an assist against Angelo State on Aug. 29. She has seven shots and six of them have been on goal.

MARSHLAND

Shelly Marsh (Sr. • Olathe, Kan.) got her first assist of the season against Rockhurst. She scored her first career game winning goal as she propelled ESU to a 1-0 win over East Central.

HOUSE OF COMMONS

Tina Commons (Sr. • Emporia, Kan.) scored her first goal of the season for the Hornets against Southwest Baptist. She was the first Hornet to be named MIAA Player of the Week since 2005. She got her first career win and shutout against Missouri Western. She is sixth in the MIAA in shut-outs this season after helping the Hornets shut out Missouri Western.

SARAH SILVERMAN PROGRAM

Sarah Anderson (Fr. • Overland Park, Kan.) scored her first career goal in the 51st minute of ESU's 2-1 win over Angelo State.

DON'T HAVE A COW-AN

Kelsey Cowan (Fr. • Olathe, Kan.) is tied with Alison Germany, Shelley Marsh, Alicia Smith and Amanda Miano for the lead in assists as each now have one.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN TIME

Lauren Cathey (So. • Fort Collins, Colo.) is doubtful for the game against MSSU with an injury. She got her first goal of the season in the 79th minute to give the Hornets a 1-0 win over Missouri Western. She is now tied for the team lead with five shots on goal.

FLETCHER LIVES

Kristin Fletcher (Jr. • Lee's Summit, Mo.) finished the season fourth on the team in blocks with 68 on the year...had 93 kills while starting 25 matches for the Hornets.

SNOOKERED

Jenna Snook (Jr. • Topeka, Kan.) spent most of last season as a defensive specialist appearing in 36 matches with one start for ESU... had 280 digs on the season averaging 2.14 per game

MILLER TIME TAKE TWO

Kaley Miller (Sr. • Stillwell, Kan.) begins her senior campaign with the Hornets in 2008...saw time in 10 matches last season where she recorded two kills and had 10 digs...could also see time as a defensive specialist this season.

KAISER ROLLS

Katelyn Kaiser (So. • Valley Center, Kan.) appeared in two matches for the Hornets last season where she had one kill and two blocks.

RECORD BOOK

During last season the Hornets had eight single season individual records broken, including four by Arica Shepard, two by Ting Liu and two by Amy Byfield...one career individual record was broken as well as Arica Shepard broke the career record for 20+ kill matches with her 16th besting the old record of 10 in only her junior season...two Hornets set individual match records while the team set three team season records...the records broken included assists with 2,010, assists per game at 15.10 and assist blocks with 475 on the season.

RECORD WATCH

Arica Shepard enters the 2008 campaign needing only 562 kills to become ESU's all-time leader in that category...she needs only 277 kills to break into the ESU top five in career kills as only a junior...
