The Hornets close out their five game road trip at Washburn in Topeka, Kan. This will be the first leg of the Turnpike Tussle that will continue on Friday when the #8 ESU volleyball team faces Washburn in White Auditorium. The Turnpike Tussle ended a in a dead heat overall last as each team earned nine victories.

THE COACHES

Jim Schneiderhahn is 8-58-3 in his fourth year at ESU and 47-102-9 in his ninth year as a head coach. He came to ESU after serving as an assistant coach at Tulane University. He was the head coach at Benedictine from 2000-04. He holds a United State Soccer Federation (USSF) National "A" Coaching License.

Tim Collins is 66-49-21 in his sixth season with the Lady Blues.

LAST TIME-OUT

The Emporia defense held the game scoreless for 77 minutes, but could not execute on the offensive end as they finished with only one shot on goal in a 1-0 loss to Northwest Missouri. ESU was outshot 15-4 overall on the chilly day in Maryville, Mo.

SCOUTING REPORT

Washburn is 6-6-0 on the season and 3-5-0 in the MIAA. They are 4-0 at Jaeger Stadium this season and are allowing only 1.40 goals against this season. They are led by Leah Talley who has five goals along with one assists on the season. Tia Stovall leads the team in assists with six on the year. Between the pipes they will feature Ashley Klone who has 51 saves on the season while allowing only 17 goals through their first 12 matches.

LAST TIME AGAINST UNO

The ESU soccer team led for 30 minutes, but gave up two goals late in a 2-1 loss at Washburn. ESU scored on their only shot on goal and were outshot 15-4 overall. Jennifer Stillmock had seven saves for the Hornets who moved to 4-13-1 on the season. Alison Germany scored the lone Hornet tally on a shot from 30 yards out getting it past the goalkeeper's block attempt.

UP NEXT

ESU will return home to face Nebraska-Omaha on Oct. 18. Kick-off for the match up is scheduled for 1 p.m. from ESU Pitch.

2009 EMPORIA STATE SOCCER GAME NOTES

A NEW PLACE TO PLAY

The Hornets will play all their scheduled home games on campus for the first time in school history. They played four games last season at ESU Pitch getting their first on campus win with a 1-0 shutout of Missouri Western on September 18, 2008. ESU Pitch is located just north of the student recreation center on the campus of Emporia State University.

AGENT SCHMITZ

Nikki Schmitz (Fr. • San Antonio, Texas) has made seven starts in goal for the Hornets this season with nine total appearances. She is 1-7 on the season with one shut-out and 58 saves. She has allowed 19 goals on the season for a 2.28 goals against average. She currently is first in the MIAA in saves per match, she ranks sixth in save percentage and tenth in goals against average.

WE GOSCHA!

Katrina Goscha (Jr. • Bucyrus, Kan.) has made three starts in goal for the Hornets and is 0-2-1 on the season. She has 10 saves and has allowed eight goals for a 2.77 goals against average.

PROPANE AND PROPANE ACCESSORIES

Ashley Hill (Fr. • Olathe, Kan.) has three goals this season for the Hornets including one game winner. She has 12 shots, seven of which have been on goal. She scored her first career goal at the 45:37 mark of the match with East Central to tie the score at one.

ROCKY HORROR PICTURE SHOW

Raquel White (Sr. • Victorville, Calif.) got her first goal of the season to give ESU the lead against East Central on their way to a 2-2 tie. She has seven shots on the season three of which have been on goal.

THE ANDERSON BUILDING

Sarah Anderson (So. • Overland Park, Kan.) added her second goal in as many games against Missouri Southern. She leads the Hornets in assists with two on the season and to her first goal against Central Missouri. She also leads the team in shots with 23 and shots on goal with 12 this year.

RALPH LAUREN

Lauren Cathey (Jr. • Ft. Collins, Colo.) got her first assist against Central Missouri. She has made the start in 45 out of 49 matches in her career. Has three shots on the season two of which have been on goal.

DEFENSE!!! DEFENSE!!!

ESU returns All-MIAA selection **Jessica Decker** who anchors a defense that features three returning starters and one newcomer. Returning starters **Kylee McCullough** and **Tessa Pettyjohn** have both made atleast eight starts for the Hornets this season. Newcomer **Sarah Whiteside** joined the defense and has started six straight games after coming back from an early season injury.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The Hornets have ten underclassmen on the roster this season with only three seniors. Only five players on the roster coming into the season had more than one year of experience playing at ESU. Three true freshman have made starts for ESU this year.
