REGIONAL SHOWDOWN

Emporia State will play #25 Missouri Western in a key MIAA and South Central Regional double header. The Hornets trail the Griffons by one game in the MIAA standings and are two spots behind MWSU in the region. It will be Dollar Day at the Diamond with admission reduced to \$1.

LAST AT BAT

The Emporia State softball team swept a double header from Southwest Baptist on Saturday at the Trusler Sports Complex. ESU won the matinee 6-2 and took a 12-4 run rule win in the night cap. Jennifer Dace was one for two with two RBI and Abby Smith had a double and two runs scored in the first game. In the night cap Angela Mahan scored three runs and had three RBI from her lead off spot.

THE COACHES

Kristi Bredbenner is 191-48 in her fourth year at Emporia State and 222-67 in five years as a head coach. She has been named MIAA Coach of the Year the last two years and her staff was named the 2006 and 2008 NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year. She has led the Hornets to two national championship games and the regional championship game in every season as head coach. She's led the Hornets to three MIAA titles as head coach and three straight conference tournament crowns. She is 9-1 against MWSU while at ESU and 12-2 all-time against the Griffons.

Jen Bagley is 258-180 in her eighth year at Missouri Western. She is 6-18 against ESU.

SCOUTING THE GRIFFONS

Missouri Western is 38-7, 11-3 in the MIAA and #25 in the NFCA Poll. They set the MIAA record for consecutive wins with 32 earlier this year and have gone 3-3 since. Becky Diehl is batting .379 with seven home runs. Shannon Pivovar has 39 RBI with a .329 batting average. Allison Jones is 21-2 with a 1.53 ERA.

SERIES RECORD

The Hornets lead the Griffons 41-22 and have won ten of the last 11 games. ESU swept MWSU to win the 2007 MIAA Tournament Championship. The last Griffon win in the series was a 4-1 decision in St. Joseph, Mo. on May 2, 2007.. The last MWSU win in Emporia was a 4-3 win on April 7, 2004.

LAST TIME AGAINST MWSU

Miranda Campbell was four for six with four RBI and her 12th homer of the year as #22 Emporia State swept Missouri Western 7-2 and 3-0 at the Trusler Sports Complex. The Hornets had five doubles in the first four innings of the opener as ESU jumped out to a 7-1 lead. Samantha Sheeley went the distance, giving up just two hits and two unearned runs while striking out seven. In game two Megan Dennis scattered three hits and struck out six as she ran her streak of consecutive scoreless innings to 24.2 innings.

ON DECK

The Hornets will travel to Washburn on April 22 for the softball edition of the Turnpike Tussle. First pitch is set for 3 p.m. This double header will be played on the WU campus after originally being scheduled for Patty Dick Field at the Hummer Sports Complex.

HORNET HISTORY

Emporia State has finished as the NCAA Division II National Runners-up twice in the last three years. ESU has qualified for NCAA Regional play five straight years and six times in the last 13 seasons. **The Hornets won the NAIA National Championship in 1983 and 1984 and won the AIAW National Championship in 1980.** ESU has won four straight MIAA regular season championships and five straight MIAA post-season tourney titles.

HOME COOKING

The Hornets have won 21 of their last 23 games at the Trusler Sports Complex. ESU has won 40 of their last 42 MIAA games in the Trusler Sports Complex. As a team the Hornets are hitting .344 at home.

TIMELY HITTING

Nearly half (100 of 211) of ESU's RBI this season have come with two outs. Six players have at least ten two-out RBI and every Hornet with at least five two-out at bats has at least three two-out RBI. As a team ESU is hitting .324 with two outs, led by Abby Hughes .429 average.

M-M GOOD

Third baseman **Miranda Campbell** (Jr./Bogota, Texas) leads the MIAA in on base percentage and walks and is second in batting average. She ranks ninth in the nation in walks and is 27th in on-base percentage. She is fourth in the league in stolen bases and fifth in runs scored, seventh in hits and slugging percentage and tenth in RBI. She was five for five with six RBI in the double header sweep of Newman on Tuesday. She is batting .528 at home with an .889 slugging percentage this season. She earned second-team All-American honors from both the NFCA and CoSIDA last season. She was named the Most Outstanding Player at the North Central Regional and to the All-Tournament team at the World Series. She was the MIAA Player of the Week after the conference tournament when she batted .615 with a home run and eight RBI. She was a first-team All-MIAA performer and earned All-Region honors from the NFCA and CoSIDA. A 3.59 student in health promotions, she was also named an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District performer.

MAHAN IN THE FIELD

Second baseman **Angela Mahan** (So./Liberty, Mo.) is ninth in the MIAA in batting, ranks third in doubles and runs scored, eighth in hits, and tenth in on base percentage. She had a seven game hitting streak snapped in the nightcap against Newman. She is batting .361 with 38 runs scored and 15 doubles. She was five for seven with three runs in the double header at PSU including the game winning run in the night cap. She was three for four with four runs scored and three RBI in the nightcap against Truman. She has started 102 of the 103 games she has played at ESU over the last two years.

DACE TO THE FINISH

First baseman **Jennifer Dace** (Jr./Olathe, Kan.) is ranked fourth in the MIAA in doubles and sixth in RBI. She is hitting .305 on the year with 32 RBI and 14 doubles. She was three for three with two doubles in the Hornets' 5-4 win at MSSU. She had two homers in ESU's 5-4 win over NWMSU. She has 14 two out RBI this season. She earned All-Tournament honors at the North Central Regional. She led ESU in RBI during the regular season on her way to First-Team All-Region honors and second-team All-MIAA accolades. She has started in 234 of her 235 games in her career at ESU.

BRATTIN DOWN THE HATCHES

Catcher **Aubree Brattin** (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) has started every game for ESU behind the plate since arriving on campus. She has thrown out ten of 24 base runners and has picked off seven this season. She is batting .325 on the year with 26 runs scored and 24 RBI. She was two for three with two doubles and four RBI in the first game against Truman. She earned honorable mention All-MIAA honors and was named to the All-Tournament team at the North Central Regional and the World Series.

COMING UP HUGHES

Shortstop **Abby Hughes** (So./Olathe, Kan.) is the only player in the MIAA to be ranked in the top ten of both home runs and stolen bases. She is fifth in the MIAA in home runs, sixth in stolen bases, seventh in RBI, eighth in runs and ninth in slugging percentage. She ranks seventh in the nation in sacrifice hits per game. She is batting .346 with nine home runs, 32 RBI and 15 stolen bases. She has a team best 15 two out RBI on the season. She transferred to ESU from Nebraska where she played in 35 games with eight starts as a freshman.

GETTING KETTER

Left fielder **Linda Ketter** (Jr./Home, Kan.) is hitting .327 with 28 runs scored and 15 RBI. She hit a home run every 10.25 at bats through her first two years at ESU.

ORDER OF THE PHOENIX

Center fielder **Jenna Potter** (Jr./Emporia, Kan.) is batting .256 with five home runs and six doubles on the year. Her diving catch preserved Megan Dennis' perfect game against Newman. She hit two home runs in the double header with Truman. She was an honorable mention All-MIAA performer as a sophomore. She began her ESU career as a pitcher but has transitioned to centerfield.

FAMILY GAL

Designated player **Jill Peters** (Sr./Wichita, Kan.) is ranked fifth in the MIAA in walks per game and ranks 43rd in the nation. She is batting .233 with four home runs on the season. Her grand slam home run was the game winner against Tarleton State. She has an on base percentage of .429 when leading of an inning this season.

SMITH AND WESSON

Right fielder **Abby Smith** (So./Liberty, Mo.) is hitting .314 with 20 RBI and .343 with runners on base. She was second-team All-MIAA at designated player last season.

DENNIS THE MENACE

Pitcher **Megan Dennis** (Sr./Liberty, Mo.) tossed a perfect game against Newman. She is fifth in the MIAA in strikeouts per 7.0 innings and wins, ninth in ERA and tenth in opponent batting average. She leads the MIAA with three saves, but is also third in complete games. She did not allow an earned run against UCM. She tossed a three hit shut out in game two at PSU after throwing the final 4.2 innings of the first game. She is 15th in the nation in saves. She picked up the win in the Hornets 2-1 victory over St. Edwards in the World Series. She was an honorable mention All-MIAA performer last season.

HEAR YE, HEAR YE!

Pitcher **Jennifer Heerey** (Fr./Wichita, Kan.) is second in the MIAA in wins and ranks seventh in ERA. She is ninth in strikeouts per 7.0 innings and opponents batting average. She had a three hit shut out of UCM. She threw back to back shut outs of Rockhurst and Incarnate Word. She is the only freshman among the MIAA top nine in wins and her 17 wins are the most by a Hornet freshman since Melissa Stevens went 20-5 in 2003.

AS A TEAM IN THE MIAA STATS

The Hornets are leading the MIAA in team batting average at .319 while not other team is hitting above .290 this season. ESU is leading the conference in slugging percentage at .484, with Washburn's .452 in second. In the field ESU is leading the league in double plays with .43 double plays per game.

ESU IN THE NATIONAL STATS

As a team the Hornets are ranked 13th in the nation in double plays per game, 34th in home runs per game, 38th in slugging percentage, 40th in doubles per game, 42nd in batting average and 46th in stolen bases per game. Individually Miranda Campbell is ranked ninth in walks and 27th in on-base percentage, Abby Hughes is seventh in sacrifice hits, Megan Dennis is 15th in saves, and Jill Peters is 43rd in walks.
