SATURDAY SPECIAL

Emporia State will take on Southwest Baptist on Saturday at the Trusler Sports Complex. The Hornets have split their last three MIAA double headers, handing UCM their first conference loss on Friday afternoon.

LAST AT BAT

The Emporia State softball team handed Central Missouri their first loss in MIAA play with a 4-0 win in the second game of their double header. The Jennies won the first game 2-0 on two unearned runs in the top of the seventh. ESU's Megan Dennis and UCM's Megan Leonard locked up in a pitcher's duel in the matinee. The Jennies scored the game winning runs with two outs in the top of the seventh. Jennifer Heerey tossed a three hitter in the night cap for her fourth shut out of the season for the Hornets.

THE COACHES

Kristi Bredbenner is 189-48 in her fourth year at Emporia State and 220-67 in five years as a head coach. She has been named MIAA Coach of the Year the last two years and her staff was named the 2006 and 2008 NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year. She has led the Hornets to two national championship games and the regional championship game in every season as head coach. She's led the Hornets to three MIAA titles as head coach and three straight conference tournament crowns. She is 7-0 against SBU while at ESU and is 9-1 all-time against the Bearcats.

Christy Capner is 42-92 in her third season at SBU. She is 0-5 against the Hornets.

SCOUTING THE BEARCATS

Southwest Baptist is 20-30 on the year and 3-11 in the MIAA. Krysta Baderdeen is batting .434 with 30 RBI to lead the Bearcats. She is also leading the MIAA in batting average. Josie Rose gets the majority of the starts in the circle and is 12-16 with a 3.26 ERA. SBU split with Washburn in their last outing.

SERIES RECORD

The Hornets lead the all-time series 29-8 and have won 11 straight against the Bearcats. The last ESU loss was a 5-1 decision on April 11, 2003 at the Trusler Sports Complex.

LAST TIME AGAINST SBU

ESU got runs in the third and fourth frame to knock off SBU 2-0 at home in the AAUW Softball Showcase. Miranda Campbell and Linda Ketter each had sacrifice flies to supply the RBI for ESU. Aubree Brattin was two for three with a double and a run scored. Megan Dennis tossed a three hitter to earn her sixth win. She struck out seven and did not walk a batter.

ON DECK

The Hornets will wrap-up an eight game home stand when they take on Missouri Western on Tuesday. It will be Dollar Day at the Diamonds as admission will be just \$1 and hot dogs and pizza will be available for just \$1 as well. First pitch of the double header is set for 4 p.m. The Hornets will then travel to Washburn on April 22. This double header will be played on the WU campus after originally being scheduled for Patty Dick Field at the Hummer Sports Complex.

HORNET HISTORY

Emporia State has finished as the NCAA Division II National Runners-up twice in the last three years. ESU has qualified for NCAA Regional play five straight years and six times in the last 13 seasons. **The Hornets won the NAIA National Championship in 1983 and 1984 and won the AIAW National Championship in 1980.** ESU has won four straight MIAA regular season championships and five straight MIAA post-season tourney titles.

HOME COOKING

The Hornets have won 19 of their last 21 games at the Trusler Sports Complex. ESU has won 38 of their last 40 MIAA games in the Trusler Sports Complex. As a team the Hornets are hitting .345 at home.

TIMELY HITTING

Exactly half (98 of 196) of ESU's RBI this season have come with two outs. Six players have at least ten two-out RBI and every Hornet with at least five two-out at bats has at least three two-out RBI. As a team ESU is hitting .324 with two outs, led by Abby Hughes .441 average.

M-M GOOD

Third baseman **Miranda Campbell** (Jr./Bogota, Texas) leads the MIAA in on base percentage and walks and is fourth in batting average. She ranks 12th in the nation in walks and is 18th in on-base percentage. She is fifth in the league in stolen bases and eighth in runs scored, hits, and slugging percentage. She was five for five with six RBI in the double header sweep of Newman on Tuesday. She is batting .621 (18 of 29) at home with a 1.069 slugging percentage this season. She earned second-team All-American honors from both the NFCA and CoSIDA last season. She was named the Most Outstanding Player at the North Central Regional and to the All-Tournament team at the World Series. She was the MIAA Player of the Week after the conference tournament when she batted .615 with a home run and eight RBI. She was a first-team All-MIAA performer and earned All-Region honors from the NFCA and CoSIDA. A 3.59 student in health promotions, she was also named an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District performer.

MAHAN IN THE FIELD

Second baseman **Angela Mahan** (So./Liberty, Mo.) is seventh in the MIAA in batting, ranks second in doubles, fourth in runs scored, seventh in hits, and ninth in on base percentage. She had a seven game hitting streak snapped in the nightcap against Newman. She is batting .359 with 32 runs scored and 14 doubles. She was five for seven with three runs in the double header at PSU including the game winning run in the night cap. She was three for four with four runs scored and three RBI in the nightcap against Truman. She has started 100 of the 101 games she has played at ESU over the last two years.

DACE TO THE FINISH

First baseman **Jennifer Dace** (Jr./Olathe, Kan.) is ranked fifth in the MIAA in doubles and tenth in RBI. She is hitting .294 on the year with 28 RBI and 13 doubles. She was three for three with two doubles in the Hornets' 5-4 win at MSSU. She had two homers in ESU's 5-4 win over NWMSU. She has 12 two out RBI this season. She earned All-Tournament honors at the North Central Regional. She led ESU in RBI during the regular season on her way to First-Team All-Region honors and second-team All-MIAA accolades. She has started in 232 of her 233 games in her career at ESU.

BRATTIN DOWN THE HATCHES

Catcher **Aubree Brattin** (Jr./Greenwood, Mo.) has started every game for ESU behind the plate since arriving on campus. She has thrown out nine of 23 base runners and has picked off six this season. She is batting .325 on the year with 23 runs scored and 23 RBI. She is ranked 41st in the nation in sacrifice flies. She was two for three with two doubles and four RBI in the first game against Truman. She earned honorable mention All-MIAA honors and was named to the All-Tournament team at the North Central Regional and the World Series.

COMING UP HUGHES

Shortstop **Abby Hughes** (So./Olathe, Kan.) is the only player in the MIAA to be ranked in the top ten of both home runs and stolen bases. She is fifth in the MIAA in home runs and seventh in stolen bases. She ranks tenth in the nation in sacrifice hits per game as well. She is batting .336 with nine home runs, 29 RBI and 13 stolen bases. She has a team best 15 two out RBI on the season. She transferred to ESU from Nebraska where she played in 35 games with eight starts as a freshman.

GETTING KETTER

Left fielder **Linda Ketter** (Jr./Home, Kan.) is hitting .330 with 25 runs scored and 15 RBI. She hit a home run every 10.25 at bats through her first two years at ESU.

ORDER OF THE PHOENIX

Center fielder **Jenna Potter** (Jr./Emporia, Kan.) is batting .254 with five home runs and six doubles on the year. Her diving catch preserved Megan Dennis' perfect game against Newman. She hit two home runs in the double header with Truman. She was an honorable mention All-MIAA performer as a sophomore. She began her ESU career as a pitcher but has transitioned to centerfield.

FAMILY GAL

Designated player **Jill Peters** (Sr./Wichita, Kan.) is ranked second in the MIAA in walks per game and ranks 16th in the nation. She is batting .250 with four home runs on the season. Her grand slam home run was the game winner against Tarleton State. She has an on base percentage of .429 when leading of an inning this season.

SMITH AND WESSON

Right fielder **Abby Smith** (So./Liberty, Mo.) is hitting .301 with 20 RBI. She was second-team All-MIAA at designated player last season.

DENNIS THE MENACE

Pitcher **Megan Dennis** (Sr./Liberty, Mo.) tossed a perfect game against Newman. She is third in the MIAA in strikeouts per 7.0 innings and seventh in wins. She leads the MIAA with three saves, but is also fifth in complete games. She tossed a three hit shut out in game two at PSU after throwing the final 4.2 innings of the first game. She has allowed one earned run and nine hits in her last 24.0 innings. She is 13th in the nation in saves. She picked up the win in the Hornets 2-1 victory over St. Edwards in the World Series. She was an honorable mention All-MIAA performer last season.

HEAR YE, HEAR YE!

Pitcher **Jennifer Heerey** (Fr./Wichita, Kan.) is third in the MIAA in wins and ranks eighth in ERA. She is eighth in strikeouts per 7.0 innings and tenth in opponents batting average. She had a no-hitter through 4.0 innings against Newman. She threw back to back shut outs of Rockhurst and Incarnate Word. She is the only freshman among the MIAA top nine in wins and her 16 wins are the most by a Hornet freshman since Melissa Stevens went 20-5 in 2003.

AS A TEAM IN THE MIAA STATS

The Hornets are leading the MIAA in team batting average at .316 and are the only team batting above .300 on the season. ESU is leading the conference in slugging percentage at .479, the only MIAA team with slugging percentage over .475 on the year. In the field ESU is leading the league in double plays with .43 double plays per game.

ESU IN THE NATIONAL STATS

As a team the Hornets are ranked 18th in the nation in double plays per game, 32nd in home runs per game, 33rd in slugging percentage, 35th in batting average and 40th in stolen bases per game. Individually Miranda Campbell is ranked 12th in walks and 18th in on-base percentage, Abby Hughes is tenth in sacrifice hits, Megan Dennis is 13th in saves, Jill Peters is 16th in walks, and Aubree Brattin is 41st in sacrifice flies.
