The first day that a class regularly meets determines the final exam block. (Example: For a class that regularly meet M T, M W, M WF, M TWR, M TWRF, W RF, W F, M only, F only, etc., the student will check the "MWF" blocks.) The time within each block on each block on the final exam schedule is determined by dropping the minutes off the regular class time. (Example: For a class that regularly begins at 9:15, 9:30, or 9:45 on Wed., the student will check the 9:00 MWF block.) Locations for Special Exams will be announced by instructor.
