The Teachers College Staff Service Award

The Teachers College Staff Service Award recognizes the outstanding and unique contributions of an individual in support of the mission of The Teachers College. **This award may be given to any unclassified or university support staff employed in The Teachers College.** The award is given only when consensus affirms the existence of exemplary contributions by an individual.

Any individual or group of individuals within The Teachers College may nominate a candidate for this award. Individuals or groups of individuals who nominate a candidate also must submit supporting materials (generally in the form of a letter) delineating the candidate's contributions. Aspects of outstanding service to be considered by the selection committee will include:

- 1. Representing the Teachers College as a positive role model/ambassador,
- 2. Supporting of the mission of ESU and The Teachers College,
- 3. Engaging in collaboration,
- 4. Exhibiting innovation, and
- 5. Demonstrating unique/exemplary contributions.

Materials submitted in support of a candidate's nomination may not exceed three pages.

The chair of the Dean's Advisory Council Jen Thomas <u>ithomas@emporia.edu</u> must receive the candidate's name and supporting documents by November 15, 2020.

The Dean's Advisory Council, or a committee designated by that council, shall serve as the selection committee for the award. The Dean's Advisory Council shall make the award decision by **December 6**, **2020** and pass on the recipient's name and pertinent information to the coordinator of the award.

The award recipient will be recognized in January at the spring semester faculty meeting of The Teachers College. The award recipient will receive \$500 stipend, as well as a plaque in recognition of the recipient's outstanding and unique contributions.
