# Special Collections and Archives Updates

Special Collections & Archives has been busy this year!

The photo to the left is from the opening of a new exhibit located in the hallway of the 1<sup>st</sup> floor, WAW Library. The exhibit is titled *World War I and the Memorial Union: Honoring Veterans, Serving Students*. This exhibit commemorates both the hundredth anniversary of America's entry into WWI and the ninety-second anniversary of the Memorial Union, which was built in tribute to students who lost their lives in the war. Displays include a Veterans Wall highlighting ESU veterans from the Spanish-American War to the Iraq War and a timeline of construction and renovations to the Memorial Union. The exhibit also features a “Comedy Club” space inspired by Woosters Entertainment Club, a venue housed in the Memorial Union from 1986 to 2010. Another activity honoring veterans has significance this spring. April 6, 1917 marked the beginning of U.S. involvement in World War I. On Thursday, April 6, 2017, Special Collections & Archives will present *War on the Wall: Allied Poster Propaganda of World War I*, a half-hour program produced for ESU’s Channel 8. The program will be introduced by Dr. Loren Pennington, Roe R. Cross Professor Emeritus of History, and followed by a panel discussion with Dr. Pennington and Lisa Soller, Curator, Lead Exhibit Technician and Education Coordinator at the Lyon County History Center. Showings will take place in the Special Collections & Archives exhibit hall, 1<sup>st</sup> floor of WAW Library, at 2:00 p.m., 4:00 p.m., and 7:30 p.m. Thursday, April 6. Seating is limited to 25.

A full-text database covering a broad range of disciplines and featuring scholarly journals, general magazines, and newspapers.

### **America: History and Life with Full Text**

A variety of full-text journals and indexing of books and other sources covering the history and culture of the United States and Canada.

### **American Indians Histories and Cultures**

Manuscripts, artwork, photographs, rare books, and more from the earliest contact with European settlers to the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century.

### **American West**

Rare and original documents, including books, journals, maps, and manuscripts, about the western expansion of America.

### **Arab World Research Source**

Academic journals, magazines, conference papers, and industry profiles for Arabic studies, Middle Eastern studies, and Islamic studies.

### **Business Source Complete**

Journals covering all disciplines of business, including marketing, management, accounting, banking, and finance.

### **CINAHL Complete**

Journals and other resources for over 50 nursing specialties.

### **Cloud Library**

A FREE e-book service from the State of Kansas Library.

### **Education Source**

Full-text, indexing, and abstracting from a number of education journals.

### **Environment Complete**

Full text and indexing of journals and other resources in agriculture, ecosystem ecology, energy, and related fields.

### **Flipster**

A digital resource of magazines and journals to read on your

computer, laptop, tablet, or other mobile device.

### **Gale Interactive Human Anatomy**

3D models of the human anatomy.

### **Library and Information Science Source**

Full text of a variety of library and information science journals and other resources.

### **Middle Eastern and Central Asian Studies**

Coverage of the culture and politics of the Middle East, Central Asia, and North Africa.

Full text and indexing of scholarly journals covering a wide array of scientific and technological subjects.

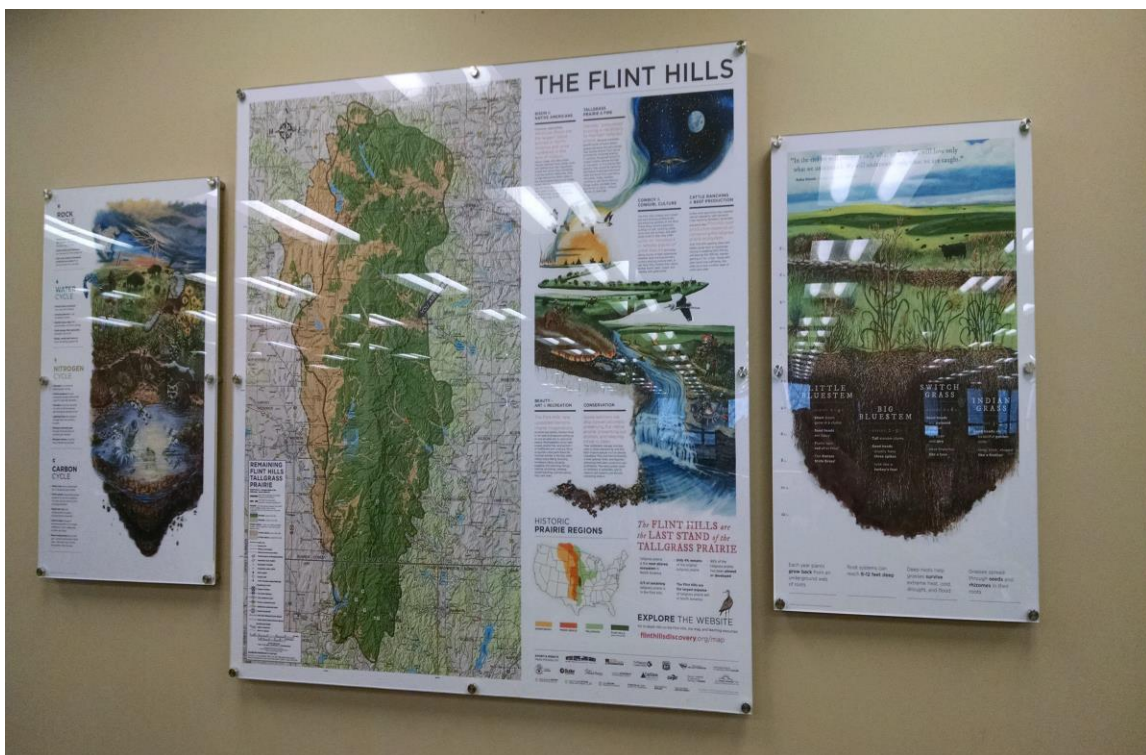


## Flint Hills Exhibit Dedication Ceremony – Wednesday, April 12

Join us starting at 2:00 p.m. Wednesday, April 12 for the official dedications of two map exhibits featuring the beautiful Flint Hills of Kansas!

There will be two ribbon-cutting events for the map exhibits. The first will take place at 2:00 p.m. in the atrium of Visser Hall, 1st floor. At 2:15 p.m., a second ribbon-cutting event will take place on the 2nd floor of the William Allen White Memorial Library. A short welcome and information about the map exhibits will then be held, with a reception immediately following in White Library.

The place-based education program, created by a grass roots team of Flint Hills teachers, scientists, ranchers and experts, is designed to deepen students' pride and understanding of their remarkable place in the world, the Kansas Flint Hills - the last four percent of tallgrass prairie in North America.
