What?

The full-day workshop activity will provide hands-on experiences using the modeling physics pedagogical approach for teaching basic physics concepts. The study of motion and forces producing motion will be the context to introduce the modeling strategy. Other physics topics will be introduced in a modeling context as time allows.

Financial Assistance

Inservice teacher enrollees are eligible for support (tuition/fees, housing, meals, and/or mileage allowance depending on whether a commuter or non-commuter) from Space Grant funds through the Kansas Space Grant Consortium. Awards will be on a first-application/first-award basis. **Priority consideration** will be given to those teachers from underrepresented populations or from districts with higher than average ethnic minority student populations. Rural district teachers are encouraged to apply, also.

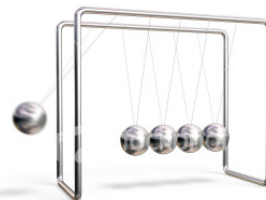
