

Strategies on how to become more marketable at graduation

Aging Studies (Retirement Planning, Activities Director, Public Relations, Banking, Travel Programs)

- Develop helping skills through volunteer positions with an emphasis on team work.
- Seek out research opportunities with faculty.
- Show an understanding of ethical issues, standards, and public responsibility in relation to professional practice.

Economist (Financial Analyst, Market Analyst, Research Assistant, Bank Officer, Appraiser, Investment Analyst, Government Consultant)

- Gain experience working with diverse populations.
- Can you show examples of numeracy and statistics?
- Consider membership with the American Economic Development Council or the Council for Urban Economic Development for internship and job listings.

Education (Secondary Teacher, Community Development, Advocacy)

- Employers will be looking for examples of data collection, analysis and interpretation, this is the capacity to collect, organize, critically assess, and present information.

- Become familiar with employment standards of other countries to demonstrate an appreciation of cultural diversity and sensitivity towards vulnerable and indigenous groups.

Public Administration (Organization Management, Nonprofit Management, Program Evaluator, Purchasing Specialist, Emergency Management, Policy Research)

- Look for opportunities that provide project management experience.
- Include the ability to structure and present logical arguments, critically analyze material and opinions, and make informed decisions.
- Show examples of working autonomously and collaboratively, including effective leadership skills, and program management capabilities.
- Consider a minor in Leadership.
