





Student Demographics based on Headcount, Fall 2010


Enrollment by Level




Enrollment Status



Resident/Non Resident Status




On- and Off-Campus Enrollment




Student Demographics based on Headcount, Fall 2010





Student Demographics based on Headcount, Fall 2010


Undergraduate Enrollment by Gender




Graduate Enrollment by Gender





Total Enrollment








First Time Traditional Age Freshmen* by Home County, Fall 2010


First Time Freshman* by County Fall 2010


Market Share of Public High School Graduates Kansas First Time Freshmen



Market Share of Total Graduates, Kansas First Time Freshmen, Fall 2009





Undergraduate Transfers to State Universities by Institution of Last Attendance, Fall 2009




Undergraduate Majors and Minors, Fall 2010

Total Majors and Minors, Fall 2010






Undergraduate Degrees Awarded, FY 2010

Total Degrees Awarded, FY 2010








Headcount* and Student Credit Hours by On- or Off-Campus and Schedule Type Fall 2010



Average Section Size Undergraduate Classes, Fall Semester





Average Section Size by Educational Level, Fall 2010








Budgeted Unclassified Positions by Program, FY 2010







Instructional, Research, and Public Service Faculty, FY 2008














Percentage of Eligible Faculty Holding Tenure, Fall 2009





Emporia State University Teaching Faculty by Department and Age Range, FY 2006 - FY 2011



Teaching Faculty by Age Range, Fall 2010











Tuition Rates for FY 2011 (Full-time, per semester)





Tuition and Fees, FY 2011 Per Semester, for Full-Time Undergraduates





Emporia State University Required Fees, Full-Time Students, Detail Per Semester FY 2000 - FY 2011





Emporia State University Required Fees Enrollments of Less than 9 Credit Hours Detail Per Semester FY 2000 - FY 2011







Five Year Undergraduate Tuition and Fees Comparison, Regents Institutions and Peers, AY 2005 and AY 2010







Numbers of Hours Worked Per Week at Minimum Wage to Finance Tuition, Fees, and On-Campus Housing at ESU FY 2000-2011
















