FSL Individual Awards 2019

Presented at the Greek Banquet 2019, April 19th, 2019

This award process starts with each chapter completing all tasks associated with being a recognized fraternity/sorority in the Officer of Fraternity and Sorority Life at Emporia State University. Those requirements can be found in the OFSL Policy and Procedure Manual.

Each individual seeking recognition must complete an online application for each award they wish to be considered for. These applications include questions about leadership experience, personal growth, resume and reference letters. Applicants are asked to really reflect and use specific examples for how they exhibit traits of an ideal awardee.

Winners of each award are determined by a judges' score. Each award recognizes awardees based on council, membership in fraternity/sorority life or one overall winner.

This individual should be someone who embodies the mission of Emporia State University and is involved not only in their chapter but in their academic department, and/or other student leadership roles on campus. This individual is a model for what it means to give back to Emporia State University as a student. This individual must have served as an officer in one or more non-fraternity/sorority organization in the past year and have a 2.5 cumulative GPA or higher.
