Four-week Student Teaching Opportunities

Student teaching at Emporia State University is traditionally a 16-week placement at an elementary or secondary school in Kansas. The Teachers College wants to expand your professional opportunities, so we have created several four-week student teaching placements. In these placements, you will complete 12 weeks of student teaching in Kansas first and then complete a special four-week opportunity to conclude the student teaching semester.

To qualify, you must complete all graduation requirements including the Kansas Performance Teaching Portfolio by the end of the 12-week student teaching placement. You must also receive approval from your advisors and department chair, and, for the international placement, complete a satisfactory interview with the Office of International Education.

- Student teaching in select districts in southwest Kansas (Grades
K-6), other school districts, private schools or charter schools

To Apply

- **For student teaching abroad,**
applications are available from either
Elementary Advising Office at the
beginning of Block 2 or Dr. Amanda
Lickteig at the beginning of Phase I.
You will need to enter in the necessary
information and secure the necessary
signatures. The International Education
Office must also approve the placement.
International liability insurance is
required and is available for free by
being a student member of the National
Education Association.
- **For student teaching with a member
of the National Teachers Hall of Fame,**
applications are available from Carol

- **For student teaching in a different
school district, private school or
charter school,** please work with
the Elementary Advising Office
(elementary) or Office of Field
Placement and Licensure (secondary)
to find a placement. Approval for the
placement requires the principal of
the placement site and either Dr. Jerry
Liss (elementary) or Shannon Hall
(secondary) to sign an agreement.

* For National Teachers Hall of Fame placements, most expenses are covered. For placements in southwest Kansas, other school districts, private schools, or charter schools, the student is responsible for expenses.
