New courses offered by Emporia State University!

In response to the increasing conversation surrounding dyslexia and the science of reading, the reading faculty at Emporia State has created a new series of courses on dyslexia. **This online series is designed following the International Dyslexia Association (IDA) Knowledge and Practice Standards for Teachers of Reading.**

Dyslexia Series Courses

EL743 Meeting the Challenges of Dyslexia 3 credit hrs

Science of Reading Foundations I 3 credit hrs

Science of Reading Foundations II 3 credit hrs

EL823 Analysis of Reading Assessment & Instruction
or

SD803 Promoting Literacy for Students with High Incidence Disabilities 3 credit hrs
(depending on concentration)

EL827 Assessing & Instructing Learners 3 credit hrs

- Courses are designed for education graduate students or inservice teachers who hold a Kansas teaching license. *(ESU undergraduate education students who are eligible for Block 2, have at least 90 undergraduate hours, senior status, and working toward teacher licensure are also invited to take these courses.)*
- Currently, there is not a KSDE-recognized certificate on dyslexia. Once a student concludes all courses in the series, a dyslexia training recognition letter will be issued. At this time, this letter is not associated or connected to a certificate or a licensure program at ESU or any state or national level organization.
