
A Penny's Worth

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Book Summary

Read Aloud Questions

How would you solve Penny's problem?

Do you know how many pennies are in a dollar?

Why do you think people call it penny candy?

What would be your plan to save nickel?

How would you improve nickel's attitude?

Do you think penny will become a sewer penny?

Why do you think a penny is good luck?

What would you wish for if you found a penny?

What makes you feel priceless?

How would you change a penny's worth?

Book Activity

Materials: brown paper plates, googly eyes, permanent markers, strips of paper, scraps of construction paper, glue.

Directions

- 1. After reading the story, help students create a penny character.
- 2. Using markers, draw a face on the front of the paper plate. Add googly eyes and other decorations to create your penny character.
- 3. Accordion fold strips of paper to create arms and legs. Add shoes and hands to the ends of the strops. Glue these to the plate.
- 4. After the penny character is completed, write or draw an adventure for your penny character on the back of the plate.
- 5. Allow students time to share their character and the story or picture of the character's adventure. Ask: What is your penny's worth? What makes them valuable?
