Book Summary

A little girl named Marjorie wants a friend, but all the kids in her neighborhood and school don't like the same things as her. She tries to find a person, like her grandmother, who enjoys the same things. She finds the community center, but gets stopped at the front desk because she is too young for the Senior Citizen Club. On her way home she gets an idea to disguise herself as a granny. Then she goes back to the club and goes inside. She walks around making new friends with the older citizens. Everything is going well until they do the Cha Cha Cha and her disguise falls off.

Read Aloud Questions

Why do you think Marjoire misses her grandma so much? Where do you think her grandma might be?
Where do you think the senior center will not allow children to visit?
What do you think Marjorie is going to do since she cannot go inside?
How do you make new friends?
What examples can you find that are signs of kindness?
What might have happened if Marjorie had not been determined to visit the senior center?
What do you think we can learn from this story?
Explain what the Cha Cha is.

Book Activity

Materials: Chinet paper plates, scraps of yarn and colored paper, scissors, glue, markers

Directions

After reading the book aloud, review the word "disguise" and discuss how Majorie disguised herself as a way to make new friends. Discuss things they might try to make a new friend in the senior center. What are the characteristics of a good friend? What are activities that you do with your friends?

Pre-cut eye holes in the paper plate. Give each student a plate and ask them to create a disguise that would allow them to get inside the senior center to make a new friend. Students may use markers and other materials to make a yarn wig, etc.

After the students have completed the masks, they may put them on and practice making new friends with the other members of the "senior center" group.
