- A. Start with your faculty advisor and other business professionals in your network.
- B. Check with the Career Services Center and your Hire-a-Hornet account at www.emporia.edu/careerservices for internship postings.
- C. Still can't find one? Visit with Career Services to cultivate an internship to match your interests.

HOW DO I APPLY??

- **Step 1** Determine your area of interest and the skills you want to develop.
- Step 2 Locate an appropriate internship site and secure a job description.
- **Step 3** Register online with Career Services, complete all internship agreement forms, returning them to Career Services.
- Step 4 If your proposal is approved, you will enroll for credit.
- **Step 5** Complete the internship.
